



## INTOXICANTS

## AND ITS HARMFUL EFFECTS



I call upon all of us to increase our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala by fulfilling all of His Commands and avoiding all of His prohibitions.

Let us increase our remembrance of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala and salawaat upon our beloved Prophet sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam, and also strive our utmost in practicing the sunnah

of Rasulullah sallAllaahu " alayhi wasallam. We truly hope that this will bring tremendous benefit in this world and the Hereafter.

Islam is a religion that calls upon mankind towards goodness and abstaining from every deed that leads to wickedness and harm. It is waajib (obligatory) upon every Muslim to safeguard themselves from falling into disobedience,

and haraam (impermissible) for the Muslim to put himself in danger or in harm's way. The consequence would be even greater if the harm involves others as well. Islam is not a religion that only preaches the aspect of spirituality.

It is not a religion that only discusses matters regarding divinity and worship. Islam emphasizes a way of life that fulfills the fitrah (natural disposition) of mankind from the aspects of material and spiritual, physical and mental,

external and internal. We have full certainty that with Islam, a person will feel blissful when these aspects are greatly fulfilled.

Based on the verse recited in the opening of the khutbah, it is evident to us that Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala has forbidden upon us a type of drink known as al-khamr. Al-Khamr is a type of beverage that intoxicates and commonly

known among us as alcoholic beverage. In this modern world, alcoholic beverages are known with various names and brands such as wine, tuak (palm wine), and many others.

These intoxicants are beverages that will lead to harm and causes its consumer to severely fall into disobedience. In a hadeeth, Rasulullah sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"Wine (al-khamr) is the mother of all vices (Umm al-Khabaa'ith). Whoever drinks it, Allah will not accept his prayers for 40 days. If he dies and there is some in his stomach, he will die the death of Jahiliyyah." (ad-Daaraqutni: hasan)

Indeed, intoxicants cause great harm and peril to mankind. It not only impairs the intellect and destroys one's health, but causes one to lose character, dismantles the akhlaaq and even 'ageedah.

Those addicted to intoxications will not only turn away from the remembrance of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala but negligent to their responsibilities as a slave The Most High and head of family

Even worse, those drowned in intoxication will be easily reeled into major sins such as fornication, fighting, and murder. This is because the intoxicant has damaged their sound reasoning and consciousness,

causing all of their actions to be based solely on their whim and desire. Intoxicants will only lead to a greater problem, which is the destruction of the family institution, society, and nation. Khamr not only causes its consumer to lose sound

judgment but can also lead to severe addiction. The alcoholics would have no concern for their own selves, family, and society. They would only be concerned on ways to ensure constant supply of intoxicants at all time

that they would resort to fighting, stealing, and even murder, just to get their dose of intoxicant. Imagine the affairs of our society and nation if such phenomenon is widespread. Moral decay will become more critical with the widespread of

alcohol consumption within society. True are the words of Rasulullah sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam that khamr is the mother of all evil and destruction.

The prohibition of consuming intoxicant in Islam is for the benefit of the entire mankind, because of its obvious negative consequences. Allah has bestowed numerous uncountable ni 'mah upon us,

with only several prohibitions decreed for the benefit of mankind themselves. But why are some defiant and violate those prohibitions? Anas bin Maalik radiyAllaahu 'anh narrated:

The Messenger of Allah sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam cursed ten with regard to wine: the one who squeezes (the grapes, etc), the one who asks for it to be squeezed, the one who drinks it, the one who carries it,

the one to whom it is carried, the one who pours it, the one who sells it and consumes its price, the one who buys it and the one for whom it is

bought. (at-Tirmidhi, ibn Maajah: saheeh)

Based on this hadeeth, it is evident to us how Islam strictly views matters regarding intoxicant. Its punishment does not only befall its consumer, but upon everyone involved in its production from the beginning until the end.

This is due to its adverse effect upon the society, which will further weaken the nation. Unfortunately, there are Muslims that consume intoxicants as a social habit and for entertainment.

They boldly reason that the small quantity consumed does not lead to intoxication. However, Jaabir radiy Allaahu 'anh narrated that the Messenger of Allah sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

## "Whatever intoxicates in a greater quantity is also unlawful in a small quantity."

(Ahmad, at-Tirmidhi, an-Nasaa'ie, ibn Maajah, and Abu Dawood: saheeh)

Hence, the justification of consuming small quantity does not lead to intoxication is totally unacceptable for its ruling is haraam, whether it is a sip or a drop only.

In Selangor, the punishment for consuming intoxicant according to Section 18, Sharee 'ah Criminal Enactment (Selangor) 1995 is a maximum fine of RM3000 and 2 years imprisonment.

For those that help prepare, offering to sell, selling, and exhibiting, can be subjected to the maximum punishment of RM5000 fine and 3 years imprisonment. Lately, intoxicant-related crime is on the rise and rampant in this

country. This indirectly contributes to the increase of the prevailing social vice. It is saddening that Muslims are always found consuming alcohol whenever raids are conducted at entertainment premises.

Unfortunately, this dilemma seems to never cease to exist, without effective solution or awareness.

Criminal statistics in Europe have indicated that alcohol consumption not only contributes to social

immoralities but also to other crimes such as domestic violence, financial crisis, murder, and others. If not effectively addressed, it is feared that it will replicate into this country.

Applying the Islamic way of life is the best solution in preventing the Muslim ummah from being entrapped with the widespread social ills especially alcohol addiction. In essence, education begins from home,

with the parents being the role model and exemplary. The modern and advanced lifestyle nowadays has made the role and responsibility of parents even more challenging in raising a faithful family institution.

This is because today's generation has been exposed to tremendous amount of influence and foreign culture that are mostly negative. However, with the correct and conducive upbringing coupled

with values emphasizing true 'ageedah of sound belief in Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala, today's Muslim generation can be nurtured and groomed into being a solid reliable generation of the future, insha Allah.

Therefore, it is the very duty and responsibility of Muslim parents to continually monitor the lives of their children at all time, so that they will not succumb to the whispers of their own desire calling unto wickedness.

Verily, this responsibility is not only for this world for it will be questioned by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala in the Afterlife.

The role of the leader as the lawmaker and enforcer is thoroughly undeniable.

The laws should be made stricter in the sales of intoxicants at entertainment centers and public commercial premises to safeguard the Muslims from being lured into its consumption, as deemed haraam in Islam.

If the Muslims are united and cooperative in resolving this matter, then intoxicants will not be a burden and nuisance to our lives, insha Allah. It is truly hoped that will all these sincere efforts, the Muslim ummah will be safeguarded from intoxicant

addiction epidemic. Let us enliven the Islamic environment within the family and community, and always alerting each other of the various social ills plaguing this country.

Let us begin to greet and advice each other, and together prevent every from of munkar amongst the neighbors, relatives, and society.

Verily, it is hoped that these noble efforts will help protect us from the torment and punishment of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala.

"Satan only wants to cause between you animosity and hatred through intoxicants and gambling and to avert you from the remembrance of Allah and from prayer. So will you not desist?"

(al-Maa'idah 5:91)
