

## AKHLAAQ: TRUE MANIFESTATION OF THE MUSLIM CHARACTER

Let us all increase our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala by fulfilling all of His Commands and strive our utmost to abstain from all of His prohibitions. It is only through the taqwa of Allah that we will

attain victory in this world and the Hereafter. Islam was legislated by Allah based upon pure unadulterated 'aqeedah and tawheed, outlining the Sharee 'ah that is just, and also based upon sound akhlaaq that is also known as ihsaan.

Without good mannerism, then our Islam would be impaired, the religion becomes deficient, and our Muslim personality tarnished, for akhlaaq manifests the inner character of a true Muslim. Sound akhlaaq radiates from the pure 'aqeedah, imaan,

and good deeds that are highly observed and practiced. Sound akhlaaq which mirrors the personality and identity of a true Muslim is the very definition of ihsaan, as it was mentioned in hadeeth Jibreel where Rasulullah sallAllaahu

## *'alayhi wasallam* stated about al-ihsaan:

"... It is to worship Allah as if you are seeing Him; and although you do not see Him, He sees you ..."

(Muslim)

Prophet Muhammad sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam was sent by Allah for the purpose of perfecting the noble akhlaaq, so that his ummah will display the utmost character and personality, purifying their deeds,

and thoroughly cleansing their hearts in becoming closer to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. A Muslim must possess sound akhlaaq that is based upon pure 'ageedah and imaan in the tawheed (Oneness) of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala,

for every action of His slaves are only by His Leave and Might. Hence, all of the actions of His slaves truly manifest their submission to the Will of Almighty Allah until they are loved and pleased with.

What our responsibility as a Muslim? We have Allah, Lord of the Words, whom we worship. We have the Sharee 'ah, the Islamic code and principles that we uphold. But why do we leave out matters pertaining to the development

and upbringing of sound akhlaaq? Indeed, we cannot escape from our very duty as parents for we will ourselves shape the akhlaaq and 'aqeedah of our precious children, that they may even become Yahood (Jewish), Nasara (Christian), or Majoos (Zoroastrian). If we stay negligent and heedless, then we will only witness a future generation that is corrupt and immoral. At times, we are too absorbed in overemphasizing on the academic excellence of our children without putting

much weight on their religious understanding, practice, and akhlaaq. Thus we raise children that excel in their academics but having corrupted akhlaaq and morals. At the end of the day, not only the parents would bear the brunt but also the society

at large would be affected with the immoralities and debased akhlaaq of our progenies. Are we are prepared and ready to answer to Munkar and Nakir in the graves, whom none will escape from their questioning -

Who is your Lord? What is your religion? Who is your prophet? What did you do? Would we be able to answer those questions if our mouths, eyes, ears, limbs, and hearts do not sincerely take Allah as our Lord, the only One worthy

of worship? If our lives and lifestyle are not according to the Sharee 'ah and Islamic teachings? If we do not take the seerah and sunnah of our beloved Prophet sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam as guiding example?

Indeed, our life in this world is not mere play or according to our whim and desire. We have an Ilaah that must be fully adhered to, and we also have teachings from the noble Prophet to guide and lead us.

If we believe in other being other than Allah, and practice laws and regulations that is other than the Laws of Allah, then the end result would be that we would not possess the akhlaaq that is prescribed in Islam.

What is that answer and reasoning that can save us from the severe torment of Allah other than never ending regret that would be of no use? Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"And if We willed, We could have deformed them, [paralyzing them] in their places so they would not be able to proceed, nor could they return."

(Yaa-Seen 36:67)

One prime example of an ugly akhlaaq that is not from the Islamic practice is the wearing of necklace by Muslim males, because this is known to be the practice of the Jewish, Christian, and Zoroastrian men. Thus, wearing a necklace by the Muslim man would only manifest clear imitation of those religions (other than Islam). When one embraces Islam by uttering the shahaadah, then the prohibition of wearing necklace automatically takes effect

for the Muslim male, as a sign of nobility and virtuous akhlaaq that reflects the absolute obedience of the Muslims towards Islamic teachings and rulings.

Unfortunately today, there are men who love imitating the women-folk by wearing jewelries such as the necklace, bracelet, and earrings. Furthermore, some of these are even made of gold. Islam prohibits the Muslim male from

wearing any necklace or bracelet for it is a clear imitation of women. Only women are allowed to wear such jewelries and ornaments. For the men, it is from the sunnah to wear a silver ring as it was practiced by Rasulullah sallAllaahu 'alayhi

wasallam. Narrated ibn 'Abbaas radiyAllaahu 'anhuma that: The Prophet sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam cursed men who imitate women and women who imitate men. (al-Bukhaari)

There are also those that wear necklace or bracelet believing that it would bring them luck or good fortune, without realizing that it is grave khurafaat (superstition) that is akin to wearing amulet, bow string, or ring believing that it will bring

good luck or protection from afflictions, which are all shirk that erases all deeds from one's 'ibaadah.

Muhammad Qutb mentioned in his book Jaahiliyyah of the Twentieth Century:

"Indeed the jaahiliy society was one that was void of the noble akhlaaq, having no courtesy and character, without politeness and kindness. They worshipped the material world and every form of worldliness,

having no true 'aqeedah and tawheed of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. They were belligerent and disobedient to any commands and laws revealed by Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala.''

Those having sound akhlaaq and true ihsaan will truly experience the grandeur and majestic of Allah. Their feelings and zeal will pierce through the inner heart, their inner soul and conscience enjoying the sweetness of having closeness

with Allah, more joyful than the pleasure of hoarding astounding amount of wealth, rows of nice big mansions, queues of luxury cars in long lines, and eminent rank among societal elites. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"[Are] men whom neither commerce nor sale distracts from the remembrance of Allah and performance of prayer and giving of zakaah. They fear a Day in which the hearts and eyes will [fearfully] turn about." (an-Noor 24:37)

To develop these virtuous akhlaaq as a reflection of the excellent Muslim character, Allah has obligated us to remember Him at all times until khushoo' is achieved. On the contrary, the livelihood in this dunya that is done purely

for the sake of dunya without being concerned about one's relationship with Allah and His Laws, insincerely displaying good character in front of others for the sake of being praised and acknowledged, none of these deeds will be rewarded by Allah

and furthermore only to incur the curse of Allah *Subhaanahu Wata 'aala* in this world and the Hereafter.

Let us return in answering the call of Muhammad sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam to having sound akhlaaq,

with full submission and obedience to the Sharee 'ah of Allah especially in our deeds, taking Rasulullah sallAllaahu 'alayhi wasallam as the true leader that is fully emulated. This is to nurture our own personality to manifest utmost

akhlaaq and virtues toward the children, family, and society. So much so that one attains true God-consciousness through full submission and obedience, wanting to attain closeness to Allah as one of His slave.

Hence, a pious father will be greatly loved by his children and family including the neighbors. If we have achieved these characteristics and devotion, then Allah will surely make us among His beloved slaves whom He is pleased with.

Let us fathers strictly ensure that our children are performing their salaah without any compromise. Let us altogether inculcate the love for reciting al-Qur'an with them, getting them attached with the masjid and going together with them

for congregational prayers. Train them be in constant dhikr of Allah and encourage them to increase their supererogatory (naafilah) prayers and fasting so that they will experience its hikmah and superiority,

and moreover instill certainty and awareness in them that Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala is All-Knowing and Ever-Watching of His slaves' actions.

"And whoever obeys Allah and His Messenger and fears Allah and is conscious of Him – it is those who are the attainers (successful ones)."

(an-Noor 24:52)

Purify their wealth and soul so that they will live according to that which pleases You. Protect the poor and needy from disbelief and everlasting poverty. Allaahummaa ameen
