



THE OBLIGATION OF BEING DUTIFULTO PARENTS



With this, we truly hope to attain blissfulness and rahmah from Allah in our lives of this world and the Hereafter.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"And your Lord has decreed that you not worship except Him, and to parents, good treatment. Whether one or both of them reach

old age [while] with you, say not to them [so much as], "uff," and do not repel them but speak to them a noble word."

(al-Israa' 17:23)

We are obligated to be dutiful to our parents and this is an obligation that must be fulfilled. Mothers are the ones that gave birth to mankind on earth, and the very beginning of everyone's lives starts with the birth from their mother.

Therefore, Islam takes serious precaution with regard to the rulings pertaining the relationship between the offspring and the parents. We have been commanded to constantly perform good deeds, be gentle and

polite to our parents. Hence, it is strictly forbidden for us to be rude to them whether through actions or even by uttering "ah" for that is a manifestation of disrespect and dislike for their actions.

Islam places heavy importance on having good relationship with parents due to all the trouble and difficulty that they endured during pregnancy, and while raising and educating us, until we become mature and independent as we are today.

Their sacrifices are tremendous, whether in terms of their effort, time, wealth, and even emotions, just so that they can see their children in the state of happiness and well-being.

So due to this, Islam has placed a huge responsibility upon the children that it is intertwined with matters pertaining to the tawheed of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala.

Nowadays, disturbing incidents and phenomenon are very rampant, with children openly disrespecting their parents, brazenly insulting their own parents, even physically assaulting them and even more tragic, murdering them.

Verily, this is from among the signs of the End of Time and that the Day of Standing is closely approaching upon us.

The issue of being dutiful and obedient to parents is indeed closely related to matters of tawheed for whoever claims to have faith in Allah and yet neglecting his obligations towards his parents, then he is not from among the believers.

The very command to worship Allah and not associating anyone with Him, which is then followed by the command to be dutiful to parents, clearly indicates the strong relationship between being obedient to Allah and dutiful to parents.

Nowadays, many within society are neglecting their responsibilities towards their parents. Also, many among us have no concern whatsoever regarding the affairs and condition of

our parents, being insensitive and unconcerned with their need in any aspects. Our mothers had excruciatingly carried us inside their wombs for nine months, having to endure various difficulties.

Upon birth, we enter this world as a very weak being that necessitates the aid and nurture of a mother with great love and care. Upon that very mercy and love, we were raised with the great love of our mothers until we become adults.

Hence, it obligates us to be dutiful to our parents, after all the troubles and hardships that they endured in our upbringing. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "And We have enjoined upon man [care] for his parents.

His mother carried him, [increasing her] in weakness upon weakness, and his weaning is in two years. Be grateful to Me and to your parents; to Me is the [final] destination."

(Luqmaan 31:14)

Truly indeed is the great role and sacrifice that our parents had made for us especially that of our mothers, so much so that Islam raised the degree of the mother higher than the father.

In the hadeeth of Mu'aawiyah bin Haidah al-Qushayri radiyAllaahu 'anh: "I asked, 'Messenger of Allah, to whom should I be dutiful?' 'Your mother,' he (sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam) replied.

I asked, 'Then whom?' 'Your mother,' he (sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam) replied. I asked, 'Then whom?' 'Your mother,' he (sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam) replied.

I asked, 'Then to whom should I be dutiful?' 'Your father,' he (sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam) replied, 'and then the next closest relative and then the next."

(at-Tirmidhi: hasan)

According to the explanation of the hadeeth, the repetition of "your mother" indicates the high status of the mother without discounting the important role of the father. The sacrifice of a mother is indeed greater,

beginning from the pregnancy stage, to childbirth, and to the upbringing of the child, which demands tremendous level of sabr and perseverance.

Therefore, the sacrifice of a mother is one that is unmatched, and it is for this reason that Islam confers a high level of respect and degree for mothers.

Let us all make muhaasabah upon ourselves and solemnly promise to always love and maintain good relationship with our parents. Always put great effort to avoid from hurting their feelings, for it is a grave sin to be committed.

Let us pledge to ourselves that we will become dutiful sons and daughters whom will not let them down in what they had hoped in us. And to always maintain the good name and reputation of our family, let alone humiliating or

degrading them. In continuing to making du'a for our parents' well-being, we should honor them through regular visits, providing adequate help and financial assistance needed,

bring them along for family vacation, maintaining good contact, and always checking on their health condition. As children, we must place higher priority for our mothers even if there are

others also deserving attention such as our spouses. The husband must be wise in arranging his priorities, and the righteous wife will truly comprehend her husband's obligation.

From the seerah of Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam, we are reminded of the story of a man named Algamah whom cared for his wife more than his own mother.

Such was his situation on his deathbed, that the Prophet sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam threatened to burn Algamah in fire if his mother does not forgive her son. With the love and care of a mother,

she forgave her son Algamah, who then was able to recite the shahaadah and breathed his last (Ahmad and at-Tabaraani: very weak, but sound meaning based on ahadeeth in Saheeh al-Bukhaari and Muslim).

Do we want such situation to befall us? This story should provide a lesson and reminder for us so that we will not be among those that betray and disobey the parents.

We must always pray for the well-being of our parents for if we were to count and enumerate their sacrifices upon us, we will never be able to repay them. Therefore, we can only afford to make du'a for their safety and prosperity, that

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala will reward them for all their efforts and sacrifice in raising us. Indeed, we shall always pray to Allah so that we will be among those that are constantly making tawbah and blessed in this world and Hereafter.

"And lower to them the wing of humility out of mercy and say, "My Lord, have mercy upon them as they brought me up [when I was] small.""
