



BATTLE OF BADR: LESSONS FROM THE GREAT



I implore all of us to increase our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala through the fulfillment of all His Commands and abstaining from all of His prohibitions.

Indeed, those that are truly successful are those having utmost taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. Today's khutbah is titled, "Battle of Badr: Lessons From The Great Event."

Every time Ramadaan al-Mubaarak reaches us, we are reminded of several great events that took place in this noble month, which behoove us to contemplate and derive lessons from them.

Among these events is the battle of Badr that occurred on 17th of Ramadaan, in the second year of Hijrah. This battle marked the beginning of

an era of victory in the struggle of Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam in conveying the message of Islam onwards.

This historical event took place after Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam received the news of the caravan led by Abu Sufyaan bin Harb making its way home from Shaam to Makkah.

Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam along with about 313 of his Companions left to intercept the convoy to make up for their property and wealth they were forced to give up in Makkah,

after their hijrah to Madeenah. Even though Abu Sufyaan's caravan had escaped from Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam and the Muslims' entourage,

no longer needing military assistance from the Quraysh of Makkah, Abu Jahl came out and led a 1000 men strong army armed with weapons, proclaiming with pride and boasting:

"By Allah! We do not desire to return until we reach Badr. We will celebrate there for 3 days, we will slaughter the camels,

consume wine, and sing until all the Arabs are informed of our coming and gathering. Hence, our dominance will become truly apparent to them."

In the wake of such crucial moments, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam quickly called for a meeting and consulted his Companions from among the Muhaajireen and Ansaar.

The Companions all gave their pledge of allegiance that they will stand strong with Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam in facing the Makkan army led by Abu Jahl.

Thus was the Will of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala for His Messenger sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam and the Companions, as it was revealed in al-Qur'an:

"Remember, O believers], when Allah promised you one of the two groups - that it would be yours - and you wished that the unarmed one would be yours.

But Allah intended to establish the truth by His words and to eliminate the disbelievers."

(al-Anfaal 8:7)

When the morning of the 17th of Ramadaan came, both sides appeared ready for battle. Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam himself had organized the Muslims' military rank in a

neat and tactical arrangement. In those moments, his full reliance and dependence was solely upon Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. With full hope,

he sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam raised his hands high supplicating to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala imploring His aid and assistance:

"O Allah! O my Rabb, fulfill that which you have promised me. O Allah! O my Rabb, bestow upon me that which had been promised. O Allah! O my Rabb, should this group be defeated today, You will no longer be worshipped."

The battle began with Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam commanding 'Ubaydah bin Haarith, Hamzah, and 'Ali radiyAllaahu 'anhum to advance forth to duel with

three Quraysh leaders that had challenged the Muslim army, and they were 'Utbah bin Rabee'ah, Shaybah bin Rabee ah, and al-Waleed bin 'Utbah. All three Muslim warriors successfully killed

their enemies, and this victory marked an early victory in jubilantly uplifting the spirit of jihaad. Then came the fierce battle. The Muslim army took a defensive position,

while Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam continuously invoked Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala until his prayers were answered, with the sending down of armies of angels that

descended in throngs, aiding the Muslim army. Such as it was mentioned by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala in al-Qur'an:

"[Remember] when you asked help of your Lord,

and He answered you, "Indeed, I will reinforce you with a thousand from the angels, following one another.""

(al-Anfaal 8:9)

From defensive, the Muslim army switched strategy and went on the offensive with the help of the Unseen (angels) army that was sent down by Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala.

The Muslim soldiers had themselves witnessed how heads and hands were cutoff without its executors to be seen. At this stage, Abu Jahl had already been killed.

and his head was brought to the Messenger sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam, to which he proclaimed that (Abu Jahl) was the Fir 'awn of this ummah.

The death of Abu Jahl had marked the end of this historic battle, with victory clearly on the side of the Muslims. There were 70 leaders of the mushrikeen that was killed and

another 70 were captured. Meanwhile, only 14 Muslim soldiers became martyrs. The news of the victory was received by the Medinans with full of joy and gratefulness, filled with loud

takbeer and tahlil unto Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. This triumph has placed Islam as a respectable religion that is a force to be reckon with. The Muslims became stronger,

no longer the victims of oppression by the kuffaar. The historical battle of Badr has given us many lessons to ponder upon and emulate in our daily lives. Among them:

1- Islam that we readily embrace and enjoy today is in actuality the fruits of utmost sacrifice and struggle undertaken by its early followers, namely the Prophet sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam

and his Companions radiyAllaahu 'anhum ajma 'een. Therefore, let us value and truly appreciate this Islam with fully embracing and practicing its very teachings.

2- Shura or having consultation before deciding upon any action in matters that has no clear textual evidence from al-Qur'an and

as-Sunnah, is the very solid foundation of Islamic administration and politics, which should not be neglected.

3-Unwavering imaan, continuous du 'a, and absolute tawakkal upon Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala are potent and effective weapons in facing any type of attacks by

the enemies of Allah and Islam, at all times. 4- The truth cannot be upheld if it is not accompanied with the right strategy, thorough planning, and systematic scheme.

5- As the Muslim ummah, we must have yaqeen that indeed Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala is All-Mighty in granting aid and victory to the Muslims even though their numbers maybe small and having limited strength.

May the spirit and zeal of the historical victory at Badr repeat itself in this century, and fuel our desire to collectively rise and fully contemplate, providing sound support to the cause of

Islam and its leadership. It is only with this that Islam will be defended, its Sharee 'ah standing strong and its rahmah to be reaped by every walks of life in the very near future, insha Allah.

"Indeed, Allah has purchased from the believers their lives and their properties [in exchange] for that they will have Paradise. They fight in the cause of Allah,

so they kill and are killed. [It is] a true promise [binding] upon Him in the Torah and the Gospel and the Our'an. And who is truer to his covenant than Allah?

So rejoice in your transaction which you have contracted. And it is that which is the great attainment."
