



AVOIDING **EXTRAVAGANCE IN** WEDDING

RECEPTION

Let us have the *taqwa* of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. Indeed, nothing is more valuable and venerated by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala from among His slaves except those having utmost taqwa.

The topic of today's khutbah is "Avoiding **Extravagance** In Wedding Reception."

Al-Qur'an has revealed the nature of dunya as being temporary enjoyment that is always deceiving mankind. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"Know that the life of this world is but amusement and diversion and adornment and boasting to one another and competition in increase of wealth and children – like the example of a rain whose

[resulting] plant growth pleases the tillers; then it dries and you see it turned yellow; then it becomes [scattered] debris. And in the Hereafter is severe

punishment and forgiveness from Allah and approval. And what is the worldly life except the enjoyment of delusion."

(al-Hadeed 57:20)

Hence, we are always reminded to make the Hereafter as our ultimate goal in life. And we are to utilize dunya as a fertile source to accumulate as much provision possible.

However, the deception and temptation of dunya continues to deceive mankind including our ownselves. Sometimes, even without adequate capability, humans still diligently strive

to taste the enjoyment of dunya even though it is short-lived, such as the day when they are crowned as bridegroom (king for a day). Nowadays, it has become a norm for many newlywed

couples to celebrate the special occasion of their lives with various preparations and expenditures. Often times, the bride and groom will don expensive

outfit and garment, sitting on the platform (bridal bed) that is filled with decorations, combined with various types of dish and savories.

This is without even considering the wedding gifts that are excessive, gifts for the attendees, the rental cost for the venue, cost for catering, rental cost for wedding garments, and the

total fee for the photography service. In reality, hosting a waleemah is from the teachings of Islam. Therefore, it must be fulfilled according to the

stipulations within the religion. If we are seeking the Pleasure of Allah, then there are various matters that must be avoided and observed:

1- "Competing" in the lavishness of wedding banquets exposes the society to the culture of luxury that will only make mankind forgetful of their ultimate purpose in the Hereafter.

Let us ponder upon how Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala described Qaroon, a man from among the people of Prophet Moosa 'alayhissalam who later became prominent within

Fir'awn's kingdom. He flaunted his wealth and opulence to this own people such that it created great fitnah within their hearts. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"So he came out before his people in his adornment. **Those who desired the** worldly life said, "Oh, would that we had like what was given

to Qaroon. Indeed, he is one of great fortune." But those who had been given knowledge said, "Woe to you! The reward of Allah is better for he

who believes and does righteousness. And none are granted it except the patient.""

(al-Qasas 28:79-80)

Hence, Qaroon's appearance with pomp and grandeur had caused some of the Children of Israel to become mesmerized and awed, only to start daydreaming and becoming deluded.

Similarly, the same goes out for wedding receptions that are held with such splendor and glitter that it gets dubbed as the "wedding of the year." These types of events and ceremonies that are

broadcasted on TV and published in magazines will definitely fascinate many audiences. They closely scrutinize the make-up on the bride's face and the art deco exhibited.

Then they begin to fantasize wishing to go through the same experience. What is worrisome is that such opulence may trigger arrogance, pride, and showing off in the heart.

2- Extravagance in wedding reception can be the cause of envy in others. Hence, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam himself had taught us to be vigilant and careful in utilizing the bounties

that Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala has bestowed upon us. He sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam mentioned in a hadeeth:

"Seek help in having your needs met by being discreet, for everyone who is blessed with something is envied." (al-Bayhaqi, at-Tabaraani: khilaaf between saheeh & da 'eef)

Therefore, we should utilize the *ni* 'mah that Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala had bestowed upon us with great moderation, not as public display to be viewed by the masses.

3- The huge spending in celebration and wedding banquet is definitely a great waste, especially if it goes way beyond the norm and the custom of the society. Even worse if the host family

has to borrow money just to organize such feast. Hence, it is very unfortunate when many offspring had been born from the wedded couple, but their debt from their wedding expenditure has yet to be paid

The masjid committee calls upon all of us to practice moderation in our lives, including in the affairs related to wedding ceremony.

Let us not be extravagant in the spending of wedding ceremonies. Are not the wasteful people brothers of shaytaan? It is the shaytaan that devilishly whisper to us to spend exorbitantly in

celebrating wedded couples. On the other hand, such high expenditure would be better utilized by the newlywed couple after their marriage, not rapidly consumed in one or two days.

May such moderation and frugality bring barakah to the newly formed family. As it was mentioned in a hadeeth where Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"The woman with the greatest blessing is the one with the least mahr."

(Ahmad, al-Bayhaqi, an-Nasaa'i: *khilaaf* between *saheeh* and *da'eef*)

The males, who will become the husband and head of family, must be responsible in supervising and advising his family members especially the wives, that they will not become

extravagant when spending for the wedding reception of their loved ones (children). Did we know that when 'Ali radiyAllaahu 'anh married Faatimah radiyAllaahu 'anha, the dowry was only

iron ring. Who is our son compared to 'Ali radiyAllaahu 'anh? And who is his wife-to-be compared to Faatimah radiyAllaahu 'anha, the great daughter of Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam? If we are still persistent in

wanting to spend, then it would be best if they are to be spent on the orphans and the needy in conjunction with the wedding ceremony. Or we can bring them in as

guests to the wedding reception and enjoy the feast. May our prudence in this life protect us from the love for dunya, envy, pride, and arrogance within the heart.

"And give the relative his right, and [also] the poor and the traveler, and do not spend wastefully. Indeed, the wasteful are brothers of the devils, and ever has Satan been to his Lord ungrateful." (al-Israa' 17:26-27)



O Allah, You are the Almighty Lord, we are grateful unto You for having bestowed upon us **Mercy and Blessings, nourishing** us to strive to continue in strengthening the Muslim nation especially the state of Selangor, as an advanced, progressive, peaceful, and benevolent state.
