




LEADERSHIP IS A GREAT AMAANAH & RESPONSIBILITY

With this, we truly hope to become among those having true taqwa, attaining salvation and success in this world and the Hereafter.

With the anniversary of the 67th birthday of His Royal Highness Sultan of Selangor, let us as residents of Selangor, express our gratefulness and pray to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala to increase our

Sultan in age, so that His Highness will stay healthy, in peace and safety. We also pray so that His Highness will always be granted the hidaayah (guidance) and inaayah (aid)

from Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala, in continuing his rulership with justice and fairness. That the state of Selangor will always be in peace and security, its residents united, and its

economy growing with the Pleasure of Allah *Subhaanahu Wata'aala*.

The topic of today's khutbah is "Leadership Is A Great Amaanah & Responsibility."

Leadership is something that is fundamental in life. Its role and function exists at all levels of society according to the need and specific demands. At the very least, each individual is a leader for his or her ownself.

An individual may be the head of the family, an organization or a club, and a nation. In short, each individual has a responsibility and carries an amaanah that must be

fulfilled to the best of his or her ability. Narrated ibn 'Umar radiyAllaahu 'anhuma that he heard the Messenger of Allah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam saying:

"Everyone of you is a guardian, and responsible for what is in his custody. The ruler is a guardian of his subjects and responsible for them; a husband is a guardian of his family and

is responsible for it; a lady is a guardian of her husband's house and is responsible for it, and a servant is a guardian of his master's property and is responsible for it."

(al-Bukhaari & Muslim)

According to this hadeeth, we are all leaders and each leader is responsible in administering, managing, and safeguarding everything that is entrusted upon them.

Islam, leadership is an amaanah and duty in ensuring the safety and well-being of the masses. Islam is a religion that covers and touches upon all aspects of lives. In matters of leadership,

Islam has underscore few guidelines to be emulated, among them:

1- Leadership in Islam carries a heavy *amaanah* and responsibility to be fulfilled that

is entrusted upon and it must not be accepted or shouldered with lightness.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"Indeed, we offered the Trust to the heavens and the earth and the mountains, and they declined to bear it and feared it; but man [undertook to] bear it. Indeed, he was unjust and ignorant."

(al-Ahzaab 33:72)

2- In Islam, leadership, position, and status are not sought after, demanded, or asked for. Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam had once reprimanded

'Abdur Rahmaan bin Samurah radiyAllaahu 'anh for asking to be appointed for a position. He sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam advised him, stating:

"O 'Abdur Rahmaan! Do not seek to be a ruler, for if you are given authority on your demand then you will be held responsible for it, but if you are given it without asking (for it),

then you will be helped (by Allah) in it. If you ever take an oath to do something and later on you find that something else is better, then you should expiate your oath and do what is better."

(al-Bukhaari)

3- Leadership in Islam is a heavy task that requires both physical and spiritual preparation. If one is weak and incapable, then the amaanah and responsibility cannot be entrusted upon

such person, what more if it is demanded. It has been narrated on the authority of Abu Dharr radiyAllaahu 'anh who said: I said to the Prophet (sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam):

"O Messenger of Allah, will you not appoint me to a public office?" He stroked my shoulder with his hand and said: "Abu Dharr, you are weak and authority is a trust. And on the Day of

Judgment it is a cause of humiliation and repentance except for one who fulfills its obligations and (properly) discharges the duties attendant thereon."

(Muslim)

Leadership in Islam is wholesome and integrated, for Islam is not limited to worldly matters or purely matters of Hereafter only. Instead, Islam encompasses all affairs including both

worldly and Hereafter, spiritual and physical, material and immaterial, in attaining blissfulness and security in this world and the Hereafter.

Therefore, Muslim leaders must be chosen from among those having taqwa, (religious) knowledge, capability, and qualified in fulfilling all the abovementioned

requirements. In Islam, rendering authority to those ineligible or unqualified is deemed as betraying the command of Allah and His Messenger.

Leaders are deeply responsible in safeguarding themselves from committing munkar and immoral deeds. They are accountable in safeguarding and ensuring matters pertaining to

'ageedah, Sharee 'ah, and akhlaaq all adheres to Islamic requirements. They are responsible in executing all matters obligated upon them well, trustworthy, responsible, and just.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "Indeed, Allah commands you to render trusts to whom they are due and when you

judge between people to judge with justice. Excellent is that which Allah instructs you. Indeed, Allah is ever Hearing and Seeing."

(an-Nisaa' 4:58)

Leadership in Islam is a heavy duty that must be fulfilled with perfection. Negligence and failure in executing the responsibilities and amaanah, whether as the head of family, society, or nation will result in

regret and loss in the Hereafter. Hence, every leaders of all levels must give their all in improving their self-quality and leadership qualities to the level of excellence. Take heed, for leadership in

Islam is not a means for accumulating wealth, acquiring status, and enjoyment in this world, but instead a heavy burden that is shouldered, waajib to be fulfilled, and will be questioned by Allah in the Hereafter.

To become an excellent leader, then Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam is the very best exemplary to be emulated. He is the ultimate role model as a father, husband, grandfather,

a loving and caring friend, who was well-liked and loved by his surrounding. He was not only a religious leader that purified the certainty and 'aqeedah of mankind from darkness unto

the light of Truth. But he was a leader that was successful in organizing excellent administration that covered all aspects of human lives, politics, governance, military economics,

education, socio-cultural lives within societies, and many more. He was also a lawmaker and nurturer of fine akhlaaq and high moral values. Such that amongst the prophets and messengers,

he sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam is the foremost and greatest. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"There has certainly been for you in the Messenger of Allah an excellent pattern for anyone whose hope is in Allah and the Last Day and [who] remembers Allah often." (al-Ahzaab 33:21)

We conclude from today's *khutbah* that:

1- Leadership is a daunting amanaah and responsibility that is garnered by every individuals and societies.

2- Leadership in Islam is comprehensive and integrated that is based upon the concept of wasatiyyah or a balanced development between the affairs of this world and Hereafter, spiritual

and physical, spiritual and material, in attaining happiness in this world and the Hereafter. 3- Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam is the best and excellent role model

that is to be emulated in leadership and all aspects of lives, so as to achieve success in this world and the Hereafter.

4- Muslim leaders must strive in creating order and peace within their jurisdictions, so the masses will attain security in their lives.

5- Leaders will surely encounter and be subjected to Allah's Court in the Hereafter, if they were negligent towards their subjects while executing their amaanah and duties.

"[The angels will be ordered], "Gather those who committed wrong, their kinds, and what they used to worship. Other than Allah, and guide them to the path of Hellfire. And stop them; indeed, they are to be questioned.""

(as-Saaffaat 37:22-24)
