



ADVICE FOR



I remind myself first and all of us. Let us have the taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala in whatever situation that we are in

Taqwa must truly exist in every Muslims, whether young or old. Indeed, true taqwa is borne from the sincere heart that truly proclaim the greatness of Allah Subhaanahu

Wata 'aala, not due to old age as its end draws near. Because none of us know when we will expire. The topic of today's khutbah is "Advice For The Youth."

Let us ponder for a moment, imagine if we are in the middle of a vast desert, under the hot blazing sun, the burning heat will make us scramble for any shade even if under a bidara (jujube) tree

or a cluster of bamboo trees. We would truly feel relieved and privileged to have found refuge even with such small area. How then would it be compared to the intense heat at the Mahshar (gathering land)?

a time when all of mankind will be gathered, waiting for their turn to be judged by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. We will feel the agony and pain of waiting under the scorching heat of

the sun in the Hereafter, which is way hotter than the intensity of the sun in this life. However, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam had told us that amid the

extreme heat, there will be seven groups of people that will be granted the shade of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala when there will be no other shade. They are: a just ruler, a youth who has

beenbrought up in the worship of Allah, a man whose heart is attached to the mosques, two persons who love each other only for Allah's sake and they meet and part in Allah's cause

a man who refuses the call of a charming woman of noble birth for illicit intercourse with her and says, 'I am afraid of Allah', a man who gives charitable gifts so secretly that his left hand

does not know what his right hand has given, and a person who remembers Allah in seclusion and his eyes are then flooded with tears. (hadeeth of Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu 'anh, collected by al-**Bukhaari and Muslim**)

Notice how Islam placed the status of the youth in this hadeeth! After the just ruler, the second category of people that will be under the shade of Allah is the youth, dedicating their youth days

in the worship of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. We should be not be amazed or astounded with the elders that are always indulging in dhikr. Do not be awestruck by our senior citizens that

are constantly in *dhikr* and remembering Allah. That is purely human nature, realizing that their end is approaching. Instead we should be perplexed and wonder when seeing elders

that are still engrossed in their worldly life. Those that take their 'ibaadah lightly, not even going to the surau or masjid other than on Friday and the two 'eids.

They should be regretful and penitent that their time is quickly expiring. Likewise with their physical strength and ability.

On the contrary, it's the direct opposite for the youth and teenagers. Those that are in their early years well below the middle age have only began to taste the "beauty" of this worldly life.

They start to twiddle and experience the enjoyment of love and romance. To them, life is still far ahead to try and indulge in the fun and games that are readily available.

However, that is the typical youth. It is their norm and inclination by nature. Just take a look at our surroundings. It is the youth that are usually lounging and bumming around idly at the

public places. Teenagers that are itchy to incite excitement by revving up their motorcycles. Also the Romeos that are busy and immersed in their love triangle with an unknown

ending and final episode. Hence, Islam demands us Muslims to give extra attention to this group of people. Whatever seedlings that we sow today will become trees that will shade

us in about 10 or 20 years down the road. If the seedlings are from plants that yield fruits and beautiful flowers, then the future is looking bright for us.

But if they are from thorny plants or trees that scatters around garbage, then the future will only pile up more problems for us.

Therefore, the masjid administration calls upon the Muslimeen. Let us educate our youth and teenagers so that they become closer to the deen. It is only with sound Islamic knowledge

that we will be spared from the grief of this world and the misery of the Hereafter. We also call upon the teenagers and those in school. Busy yourselves with ʻibaadah.

Have you acquired all the knowledge of *fiqh* required? Have you completed the various branches of fard al-'ayn obligated before death comes calling?

Are we now able to recite al-Qur'an fluently with its proper recitation? Are we able to perform the adhaan and *iqaamah*, or at least respond to the mu'adhdhin's call to prayer?

Take advantage of the youthful age with various acts of *'ibaadah.* Know that *'ibaadah* does not impede one from any sporting activities, but do not overindulge in in games or

sports that the surau and masjid is left empty. The Muslim teens should seize the opportunity while they are still young, for the promise and reward at the Mahshar awaits them,

honoring them with lofty status in the Sight of Allah. Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "It is We who relate to

you, [O Muhammad], their story in truth. Indeed, they were youths who believed in their Lord, and We increased them in guidance." (al-Kahf 18:13)

Take the youth of As-haabul Kahfi as role models and exemplar. They fled to safeguard and protect their imaan. Take and emulate the Companions of Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam

as role models for their unwavering commitment and dedication in defending Allah's Messenger in creating change, radiyAllaahu 'anhum ajma'een.

Let us not pay attention to those non-Muslims that are engulfed and deluded with K-Pop and Gangnam Style. Let us not be affected and swayed by non-beneficial entertainment.

Let us not become absorbed and negligent with the social media, which only delays our bedtime. In result, we would miss the time for salaatul fajr, only to wake up during its prohibited time.

Let us look at the Companion named Usaamah bin Zayd radiyAllaahu 'anh who led the Muslim army against the Romans at the age of 18.

Emulate the *taqwa* of Muhammad al-Fatih rahimahullahwho led the Muslim army conquering Konstantin (Constantinople – modern day Instanbul) at the age of 21.

Let us learn further about Islam, our *deen*, for Islam is not only a religion that administers the affairs of *'ibaadah* in the surau and masjid. Instead, it is a *deen* that takes mankind

out of the enslavement of men unto full servitude to Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. It is a religion that rescues mankind from the oppression of men, and a religion that takes mankind

out from the narrowness of this world to the vastness of the world and the Hereafter. If we want to be in love, then indulge in romance after wedlock. If we want fun and entertainment,

then pursue means that will take us closer to our Almighty Creator. If we want to play games, then play moderately without jeopardizing our ʻibaadah.

Indeed, our offspring are precious assets that are invaluable and priceless. They are an amaanah that Allah has bestowed upon the parents to be guarded and raised sufficiently.

Therefore, let us heed the advice of 'Umar radiyAllaahu 'anh to his companions: "Educate your children, for verily they are born for a time that is beyond yours."


Hence, let us altogether shoulder the responsibility to teach and provide proper guidance so that our youth will not deviate from the noble authentic teachings of Islam.

(Maryam 19:59)
