



ATTAINING ALLAH'S

PLEASURE THROUGH OUR OCCUPATIONS

Let us have the *taqwa* of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala by fulfilling all of His Commands and avoiding all of His prohibitions. Verily, we truly hope to attain barakah in our lives in this world

and His Rahmah and Maghfirah in the Hereafter. Today's khutbah is intended to propel us in "Attaining Allah's **Pleasure Through Our** Occupations."

Islam obligates upon the Muslim ummah to make effort and strive in attaining bounties and provisions that Allah had prepared on this earth, whether on land or in the sea. To work and strive

in earning livelihood is an obligation for it is the condition in attaining *rizq*, for the survival of human lives. Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"And We have certainly established you upon the earth and made for you therein ways of livelihood. Little are you grateful." (al-A'raaf 7:10)

Working or doing good deeds is a form of 'ibaadah if it is performed according to the ways commanded by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. In al-Qur'an, Allah expounds that faith and

action are the foundations in attaining great rewards in the Hereafter, aside from being rewarded in earning livelihood in this world. It is imperative for us to always strive to increase our imaan

and 'amal, and efforts in earning our rizq. We cannot solidify our imaan by abandoning righteous deeds, and vice versa, increasing 'amal while disregarding the importance of belief.

In the hadeeth of ibn 'Umar radiyAllaahu 'anhuma, Rasulullah said: "Imaan is not accepted without 'amal (action), and there is no 'amal without imaan." (at-Tabaraani: da 'eef)

Islam is very firm in ensuring that one's imaan is always safeguarded even while seeking livelihood or sustenance. One should not be drowned in efforts of finding and attaining worldly

needs without thinking about the need for life in the Hereafter. Furthermore, Islam calls for mankind to always maintain good ties amongst each other, protecting the environment,

and responsible in executing work. Islam forbids mankind from causing destruction on earth that is filled with beauty, a gift from Allah to all creations. Selfish attitude such as greed, oppressing

others in maximizing gain, and destroying the environment regardless of reason are deemed as causing destruction that is vehemently prohibited by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "But seek, through that which Allah has given you, the home of the Hereafter; and [yet], do not forget

forget your share of the world. And do good as Allah has done good to you. And desire not corruption in the land. Indeed, Allah does not like corrupters." (al-Qasas 28:77)

Islam has outlined clear principles regarding work deemed as righteous deeds by the believers. Among them: 1. The intention and objective must be to worship Allah.

2. The work performed should not contradict the Sharee 'ah. 3. The occupation should not inflict harm upon its doer, the lives of others, other creations, and the universe.

4. The work is done with full effort and diligence 5. The work does not impede or prevent from fulfilling the obligatory 'ibaadah commanded by Allah.

Therefore, the worker that strive to attain good deeds, solely to gain the pleasure of Allah, should make sure to have the intention with utmost sincerity only for the sake of Allah.

Anything done that is not for the sake of Allah is rendered in vain, only gaining worldly reward. In the famous hadeeth of 'Umar ibn al-Khattaab radiyAllaahu 'anh, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi

wasallam said: "The reward of deeds depends upon the intentions and every person will get the reward according to what he has intended..." (al-Bukhaari)

Aside from intention, the occupation must not go against Shar'i rulings. Nowadays, many Muslims claim to work for the sake of Allah while in reality their work clearly contradicts the

Sharee 'ah, working in places such as gambling outlets, nightclubs, brewery, liquor stores, hired as blackmailer or hit man or bouncer, workplace that is involved with ribaa,

massage parlors even if licensed, and many others. These occupations would hardly be 'ibaadah to Allah for they clearly contradict Shar'i rulings.

In a hadeeth, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"The greatest losers on the Day of Judgment are those who receive wages

(income) from proceeds of unlawful occupation, which leads them to Hell."

(at-Tirmidhi)

There are those out there diligently working with good intention. But in reality, they also are in loss due to the devil's deceptions while at work, by accepting bribery, abuse of power,

spreading calumnies among coworkers, fanning the flame of envy, and many other despicable acts. Also not forgetting, those that fulfill their duty at work with excellence but fail in

safeguarding their Islamic duties that are far more important such as the five daily prayers, covering the 'awrah, and observing the Islamic etiquettes for interactions between

opposite gender at the workplace. They dream of attaining great rewards from their deeds, but in reality, they were duped with delusions.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "Whoever desires the life of this world and its adornments - We fully

repay them for their deeds therein, and they therein will not be deprived."

(Hood 11:15)

One thing for sure is that any work performed that is in accordance with the Sharee 'ah, they will be rendered by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala as good deeds and greatly

rewarded as promised. On the contrary, anything done that goes against the Sharee'ah will only incur severe torment from Allah, as He promised. Hence, we will all be held responsible


in front of Allah and all of our deeds in this perishable life will be accounted for. Therefore, let us strive to ensure that all of our deeds and occupation truly complies with

the *Sharee 'ah*, and truly worthy of great rewards promised by Allah, earning His Forgiveness and Pleasure in the Hereafter.

"And say, "Do [as you will], for Allah will see your deeds, and [so, will] His Messenger and the believers. And you will be returned to

the Knower of the unseen and the witnessed, and He will inform you of what you used to do.""

(at-Tawbah 9:105)
