Any actions or deeds that may offend the guests will not be tolerated so that the guests will not become upset or displeased, so what more if they are very well-respected and distinguished

Today, we have been granted the opportunity once more to give the welcoming message upon the arrival of our noble guest Ramadaan that was distinctively sent by Allah

Subhaanahu Wata'aala, the only month that was specifically mentioned by name in the Holy Qur'an.

"The month of Ramadaan [is that] in which was revealed the Qur'an,

### a guidance for the people and clear proofs of guidance and criterion." (al-Baqarah 2:185)

### And we embrace it with our du'a:

Allaahu Akbar! O Allah, bestow upon us imaan and peace, security and Islam (full submission), your tawfeeq and hidaayah upon

that which You like and are pleased with. O hilaal, our Lord and your Lord is Allah Alone. Ahlan bika ya Ramadaan (Welcome O Ramadaan) ...

We must strive with great effort in serving and fulfilling its needs with esteem, hoping to reap heaps of reward that are everlasting. In preparing to welcome our noble guest,

the khateeb would like to mention a question that was once asked by ash-Shaheed al-Mihraab Shaykh Sa'eed Ramadaan al-Bouti, that is:

Is it true that the Muslims really fast every time Ramadaan arrives? Shaykh al-Bouti is not denying that every Muslims are diligently performing their 'ibaadah of fasting by abstaining from

food and drink during the day, and praying taraweeh and giyaam during the night. These are all manifestations of their utmost taqwa with Allah. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in

al-Qur'an: "That [is so]. And whoever honours the symbols of Allah – indeed, it is from the piety of hearts." (al-Hajj 22:32)

However, what is worrisome to al-Bouti is whether the Muslims truly respect the coming of Ramadaan? It is undeniable that the Muslims will be out on the streets, in the market including bazaar

Ramadaan, in the shopping malls, in government offices, in hotels, and everywhere else. Does the true appreciation and respect for Ramadaan truly exist in those locations?

Or is it the opposite? Let us make muhaasabah as thorough as we can, and ponder upon this question: Are the Muslims embracing this noble Ramadaan with humility and bashfulness?

Are they always observing the ethics and conducts of Ramadaan? Are they safeguarding and respecting its sanctity, or are there still those that rudely consume food in public,

abandoning their prayers, committing vices, and behaving indifferent as compared to other months? While in reality, such honour and reverence are to be heavily observed during

Ramadaan. Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"It is not for a believing man or a believing woman, when Allah and His Messenger have decided

a matter, that they should [thereafter] have any choice about their affair. And whoever disobeys Allah and His Messenger has certainly strayed into clear error."

(al-Ahzaab 33:36)

Narrated Abu Muhammad 'Abdullah ibn 'Amr ibn al-'As radiyAllaahu 'anhuma, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"None of you [truly] believes until his desires are subservient to that which I have brought." (Forty Ahadeeth of an-Nawawi, #41: hasan saheeh)

So, then the next question begs: Are the Muslims truly fearful and nervous in embracing the noble month of Ramadaan if they continue to become rebels to Allah, The Almighty and

## All-Strong? Whilst Allah has sternly warned them in al-Qur'an:

"... and be afraid of [only]

Me."

(al-Baqarah 2:40)

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "The Day they are dragged into the Fire on their faces [it will be said], "Taste the touch of Sagar."

(al-Qamar 54:48)

All these while, Ramadaan after Ramadaan, sufficient if you are ready to accept changes. Break free from the shackles of ignorance and become that new and cleansed person.

Verily, the traditional Malay mind is very susceptible in loving to change for the better, that the Malay proverb describes the disgrace and shame in not wanting to change, in saying:

"Even after ten junks (Chinese sailing vessels) have anchored, the dog's loincloth is still its tail."

It means that, dozens upon dozens of merchant vessels have docked bringing in

commerce goods including clothes and goods to fulfill the demand of modern and civilized living. But even then, there are still those that stubbornly refuse to accept changes, like the dog with only its tail as its loincloth.

"For each one are successive [angels] before and behind him who protect him by the decree of Allah. Indeed, Allah will not change the condition of a people until

they change what is in themselves. And when Allah intends for a people ill, there is no repelling it. And there is not for them besides Him any patron." (ar-Ra'd 13:11)
