

THE NIGHT OF ATHOUSAND MONTHS



I implore on all of us to strive to increase our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala by performing all of His Commands and abstaining from all of His prohibitions.

Let us increase our remembrance of Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala, and increase our salawaat and salaam upon our beloved Prophet Muhammad sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam,

in addition to always striving to perform all of his sunnah. We truly hope that this will bring upon us benefit in this world and the Hereafter. On this blessed day, let us ponder upon the khutbah titled: "The Night Of A Thousand Months."

The night of a thousand month or also referred to as Laylatul Qadr in al-Qur'an is indeed a very special night, granted by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala only to the ummah of Muhammad

sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam. As it was mentioned in al-Qur'an: "Indeed, We sent it down during a blessed night. Indeed, We were to warn [mankind]."

(ad-Dukhaan 44:3)

Laylatul Qadr reminds the Muslim ummah upon the historical event regarding the revelation of al-Qur'an. On this blessed night, Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala sent down al-Qur'an to Prophet

Muhamad sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam to be spread to the entire mankind. This al-Qur'an contains the greatest miracle that becomes the manual, guidance, and mentor for mankind in

attaining a life that is peaceful, prosperous, and eternal until the realm of the Hereafter. Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"This is the Book about which there is no doubt, a guidance for those conscious of Allah." (al-Baqarah 2:2)

The revelation of al-Qur'an is not for mere admiration or to be recited only in Ramadaan or certain occasions, but instead it is the very duty for the Muslim ummah to practice and

implement upon its teachings. All the commands mentioned are not only pertaining to specific 'ibaadah that are personal in nature, but also touches upon aspects of societal living

including matters of mu'ammalaat, punishment, and governance. Hence, practicing upon al-Qur'an must be implemented in totality without omitting even a tiny bit of the

commands prescribed. We as Muslims must always strive to comprehend and ponder upon the contents of al-Qur'an to our level best. In this regard, Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala has

mentioned that: "[This is] a blessed Book which We have revealed to you, [O Muhammad], that they might reflect upon its verses and that those of understanding would be reminded."

(Saad 38:29)

By contemplating upon the verses of al-Qur'an, our hearts will be trembled by the warnings from Allah

Subhaanahu Wata'aala upon the transgressors, hence propelling us to obey all of His Commands and avoiding all of His prohibitions. Our obedience towards His Orders will cause our heart

will cause our hearts to be peaceful and tranquil, furthermore assuring blissfulness in our lives of this world and the Hereafter. However it is very unfortunate that we find

many within the Muslim ummah that refuse to seek happiness through the teachings of al-Qur'an. Not to mention that a portion of the Muslims are still unable to recite al-Qur'an so what

more to understand and practice upon them. The refusal and failure of the Muslim ummah in contemplating upon al-Qur'an is the very reason to all the various crises

that are destroying their akhlaaq and 'ageedah. When al-Qur'an is not made as the comforter of the heart, it will only be replaced by worldly entertainment that excites the heart, causing the person to

become negligent, careless, and abandons al-Qur'an from his lives. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"Indeed, those who disbelieve in the message after it has come to them (shall receive the punishment). And indeed, it is a mighty Book." (al-Fussilat 41:41)

Thus, it behoove us to appreciate the gift of al-Qur'an's revelation on the night of Laylatul Qadr by preserving and ennobling it to the utmost level in the overall structure of human

lives. Al-Qur'an must be made as the manual in our lives, beginning from ourselves, our family members, our community, and ultimately in our ruling and governance.

Laylatul Qadr that was chosen by Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala for the revelation of al-Qur'an is itself a gift unequaled bestowed upon the ummah living at the End of Time.

That is why Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam strongly encouraged his ummah to strive in attaining the reward of Laylatul Qadr. This was mentioned in the hadeeth of 'A'ishah

radiyAllaahu 'anha where he sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam mentioned:

"Look for Laylatul Qadr in the last ten nights of Ramadaan."
[Muslim]

The final phase of Ramadaan should be utilized to the max in seeking Laylatul Qadr, a blessed night that is more virtuous than a thousand month, specially made for the slaves

that are craving nearness to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. Aside from the 'ibaadah of fasting, there are various deeds that can be performed, among them:

1- Increasing the tilaawah (recitation) of al-Qur'an with tadabbur (contemplation), studying, and reflecting upon its contents.

2- Increasing in *sadaqah* (charity) throughout the

entire month of Ramadaan. 3- Istiquamah upon the practice of qiyaam al-layl as it was recommended by Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam, whether performed in jamaa 'ah

the masjid and surau or with family members at home. 4- Increasing many other supererogatory acts (naafilah) such as the rawaatib sunnah, taraweeh, and others.

5- Attending and frequenting circles of knowledge that are held at various *masaajid* or *suraus*.

All these deeds and many other good deeds, if performed with diligence and full sincerity, insha Allah will assist us in finding Laylatul Qadr.

Indeed Laylatul Qadr is from among the ni 'mah of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala that is enormous in reward without time specification, so that it will motivate us to race in

performing good deeds and 'ibaadah to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. However, it is rather unfortunate when we find many Muslims today are too preoccupied with the

preparation for 'eidulfitr instead of seizing the opportunity to seek Laylatul Qadr which appears only once a year. Whereas its reward is far greater when compared to our lifespan

where many of us won't even reach a thousand months. Hence, it is incumbent upon us to be thankful for the gift of Laylatul Qadr just like the gift of al-Qur'an.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "And [remember] when your Lord proclaimed, 'If you are grateful,

I will surely increase you [in favor]; but if you deny, indeed, My punishment is severe."

(Ibraaheem 14:7)

Our token of appreciation and gratefulness for the bounty of Laylatul Qadr is manifested by enlivening the final nights of Ramadaan with 'ibaadah as it was prescribed by Rasulullah

sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam. Therefore, in the midst of our busy preparation for 'eidulfitr, it is unbecoming for us to neglect or abandon a great and unmissable bounty from Allah

Subhaanahu Wata 'aala that is Laylat al-Qadr. We must be wise in dividing our time in the preparation for 'eid and 'ibaadah to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala, especially in the noble effort

to seek Laylatul Qadr in these last ten nights. With such wisdom, we will not be left out by Laylatul Qadr just like that, and at the same time will celebrate 'eidulfitr with perfection.

Indeed, Ramadaan will leave us in just a matter of days. Therefore, let us strive to increase our deeds and make du 'a to The Almighty so that we will find Laylatul Qadr in this blessed month.

Let us practice upon the du'a that was taught by Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam as it was narrated by 'A'ishah radiyAllaahu 'anha when she inquired from him:

"O Messenger of Allah! What if I knew which night Laylatul Qadr was, then what should I say in it?" He said, "Say: 'Allahumma innaka

'affuwwun tuhibbul 'afwa fa'fu 'annee.' (O Allah indeed You are the Pardoner, You love to Pardon, so Pardon me)."

(at-Tirmidhi and ibn Maajah: saheeh)

"Is one who is devoutly obedient during periods of the night, prostrating and standing [in prayer], fearing the Hereafter and hoping for the mercy of his Lord, [like one who does

not]? Say, "Are those who know equal to those who do not know?" Only they will remember [who are] people of understanding." (az-Zumar 39:9)

Purify their wealth and soul so that they will live according to that which pleases You. Protect the poor and needy from disbelief and everlasting poverty. Allaahummaa ameen
