I remind myself first and foremost, and all of us, to strive our utmost in increasing our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala by fulfilling all of

His Commands and abstaining from all of His prohibitions. Also, striving to adhere to the sunnah of our beloved Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam by implementing what commanded and avoiding what he prohibited. Indeed, we hope to become individuals having the utmost taqwa, attaining salvation in this world and the Hereafter.

In conjunction with Labor Day which falls on the 1st of May every year, I would like to invite fellow audience to contemplate upon the khutbah entitled "Having Tagwa In The Service Of Others."

Islam has stipulated seeking livelihood or working as fard (obligatory) upon the Muslim ummah for those that are capable and having the means to work, in attaining happiness and

prosperity whether upon the individual or the society as a whole.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "And say, "Do [as you will], for Allah will see your

deeds, and [so, will] His Messenger and the believers. And you will be returned to the Knower of the unseen and the witnessed, and He will inform you of what you

used to do."" (at-Tawbah 9:105)

Offering services while driven by taqwa and filled with noble Islamic values is the secret recipe for a great and solid achievement at all

times. Noble Islamic values will not perish with the changing of times for Islam will forever remain relevant at all places, circumstances, and times.

Having tagwa in providing service will lead such work towards betterment, beauty, glory, and excellence. It will also drive us to perform our work with concentration and diligence,

by pouring all of our time, energy, and thoughts in achieving excellence and success. Its purpose is to bring about benefit to the society and Muslim ummah.

In the hadeeth of 'A'ishah radiyAllaahu 'anha, Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"Verily, Allah loves that if one does a job he perfects it."

(al-Bayhaqi: hasan)

To attain taqwa in our service of others, then such work must fulfill these conditions: 1- The intention to work is purely for the sake of Allah. Every occupation or work

that is pursued by the slave of Allah will be judged based upon its intention. If it is solely seeking the pleasure of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala, then it will attain the pleasure of Allah

Subhaanahu Wata'aala and rewarded accordingly.
Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"And of the people is he who sells himself, seeking means to the approval of Allah. And Allah is kind to [His] servants." (al-Baqarah 2:207)

2- Working with diligence in attaining excellence Working with diligence is a requirement in Islam that is directly related with the value of that 'ibaadah itself.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "Whoever does righteousness, whether male or female, while he is a believer - We will surely

cause him to live a good life, and We will surely give them their reward [in the Hereafter] according to the best of what they used to do." (an-Nahl 16:97)

3- Seeking halaal sustenance. The need to seek livelihood that is halaal or making a living that is pleasing to Allah is an obligation upon every Muslim.

This was explained in the hadeeth of Anas radiy Allaahu 'anh that Rasulullah sall Allahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"The seeking of halaal sustenance is an obligation upon the Muslim." (ad-Daylami: da'eef with correct meaning)

4- Instilling Islamic work values.

Every occupation or work accomplished must conform with the Sharee 'ah of Islam. Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

"O you who have believed, enter into Islam completely [and perfectly] and do not follow the footsteps of Satan. Indeed, he is to you a clear enemy."

(al-Baqarah

2:208)

5-Always safeguarding the relationship with Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala. We must always fulfill our obligations towards Allah by fulfilling the five daily prayers,

covering the 'awrah, fulfilling zakaah, observing the limits of interaction between opposite genders (non-mahram), and our code of conduct, so as to not fall into disobedience.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "And establish prayer and give zakaah, and whatever good you put

forward for yourselves - you will find it with Allah. Indeed, Allah of what you do, is Seeing."

(al-Baqarah 2:110)

6- Amaanah (trustworthiness) in our work.

We must always preserve the amaanah (trust) of our work such as observing our work hours,

safeguarding the properties, completing the workload, and avoiding corruption such as bribery, breach of trust, wrongdoing, and power abuse.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "O you who have believed, do not betray Allah and the Messenger or betray your trusts while you know

[the consequence]." (al-Anfaal 8:27)

7- Possessing virtuous *akhlaaq*.
In carrying out our work, we must always remain

cheerful, customer-friendly, and not discriminating based upon stature and position. On the authority of Abu Hurayrah, radiy Allaahu 'anh Rasulullah sallAllahu 'alayhi wasallam said:

"The most complete of the believers in faith, is the one with the best character among them. And the best of you are those who are best to your women."

(at-Tirmidhi: hasan saheeh)

Hopefully, when we have fully understood the importance of taqwa in providing services, then it will bear fruits in our lives and career.

Therefore, let us strive to inculcate those characteristics and features as guidelines in our occupation or livelihood.

With such, we sincerely hope to attain the blessings and pleasure of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala.
