**I remind myself and implore
on fellow congregation, to
strive our utmost in
increasing our *taqwa* of
Allah *Subhaanahu
Wata'aala* by fulfilling all of**

His Commands and avoiding
all of His prohibitions. May
we attain blissfulness in this
world and the Hereafter.

The title of the *khutbah* that
will be delivered today is:

***“The Commitment To Uphold
Islam”***

Indeed, Islam is an exalted religion and nothing is exalted above it.

It was narrated from

'Aa'idh bin 'Amru

radiyAllaahu'anh:

Rasulullah ﷺ said:

**“Islam should prevail and
should not be prevailed
over”**

(al-Bayhaqi and ad-Daaraqutni: hasan)

**The glorified position of
Islam should be felt by every**

Muslim, not solely based on assumptions but instead it should be firmly founded upon sound knowledge and research without neglecting righteous deeds.

Many negative perceptions regarding Islam espoused by irresponsible entities are due to their misunderstanding and also our own failure to project authentic Islam in ourselves and our deeds.

We assumed that whatever we have been practicing since young that are compatible with our lives are actually true Islam. The failure to properly comprehend Islam is due to

**our lackadaisical attitude in
attaining real authentic
Islamic knowledge. Hence,
we as Muslims must work
harder to attain as much
authentic Islamic
knowledge as possible
whether in**

**courses, lectures, lessons,
books, magazines, and
other forms.**

**A civilized society is a
society that has mutual
respect with others,
promoting peace, justice,
and**

the rights to practice religion. Islam is a religion of peace and harmony where its adherents are not to disturb the beliefs of other religions that exist in this world.

**Islam is a firm religion
where we as adherents
must not at all provide
any opportunity for
others to question and
mock this religion.
Such firmness has been**

recorded in Islamic history during the reign of Caliph Mu'tasim Billaah of the Abbasid Caliphate, as was mentioned in the book titled *"al-Kaamil fee at-Taareekh"* by ibn al-Atheer. The Caliph

had defended the honor of a Muslimah who lived in a faraway land that was not yet conquered by the Muslims. The dignity of this Muslimah was violated where a Roman man had uncovered her,

intending to expose her
'awrah and humiliate her.
This heinous act had
caused the Muslimah to
scream, "*O Mu'tasim,*
where are you?" Her cry
actually came to his
knowledge and he

**straightaway commanded
for a military expedition to
defend the honor of the
Muslim woman.**

**Such was the greatness of
Caliph Mu'tasim in
protecting the honor of
the**

Muslims, ensuring that Islam is not mocked at or derided.

This historical account regarding Caliph al-Mu'tasim Billaah's firmness provides several valuable lessons for us.

First, we should always ensure the stature of Islam as the noblest above other ranks. We should give priority to beliefs that is based upon *'aqeedah* and the *Sharee'ah* of Allah without

distinguishing the levels
and degrees between the
rich and the poor. It is due
to the solid *imaan* that
Caliph al-Mu'tasim took
such courageous decision
to defend the Muslimah
sharing

the same *'aqeedah* even though she was not a citizen subjected to his rule.

Second, the Muslim *ummah* must ensure that virtuous personal qualities are embedded within every

Muslim and its society.
Therefore, the Muslims
must practice all Islamic
teachings that encompass
their entire lives. Allah
Subhaanahu Wata'aala
mentions in al-Qur'an:

**“O you who have believed,
enter into Islam completely
[and perfectly] and do not
follow the footsteps of Satan.
Indeed, he is to you a clear
enemy”**

(al-Baqarah 2:208)

**On the authority of Abu
Muhammad ‘Abdullah bin
‘Amr bin al-‘As
radiyAllaahu‘anhuma
said: Rasulullah ﷺ said:
“None of you [truly]
believes until his desires**

**are subservient to that
which I have brought”**

*(No. 41 from an-Nawawi's 40
Hadeeth: saheeh)*

Third, we shall practice with what we believe in for it is with those deeds that our beliefs will increase and our *imaan* becomes solidified. Imagine the strength of the conviction of a Muslimah

living under the reign of a non-believing king, having the courage to call upon Caliph Mu'tasim, firmly believing in his faith and justice. Faith is born out of strong commitment and

istiqaamah drives towards
continuous deeds.

Allah *Subhaanahu*

Wata'aala mentions in al-

Qur'an:

“Say, “Indeed, my prayer,
my rites of sacrifice, my

**living and my dying are
for Allah, Lord of the
worlds”””**

(al-An'am 6:162)

Fourth, we must realize that the ties of brotherhood amongst Muslims are very important where the strength or weakness of a society lies upon the soundness of these ties. Strong *silaaturrahm*

amongst Muslims will
cause the Muslims to
appear as strong and
difficult to be humiliated
and mocked at.

Allah *Subhaanahu*

Wata'aala mentions in al-
Qur'an:

**“And if they had intended
to go forth, they would
have prepared for it
[some] preparation. But
Allah disliked their being
sent,**

**so He kept them back,
and they were told,
“Remain [behind] with
those who remain”**

(at-Tawbah 9:46)

Lastly, we should learn from the story of Caliph Mu'tasim regarding the importance of being concerned and having compassion for the Muslims. The virtue of compassion amongst Muslims is not only

guaranteed with
tremendous reward in the
Hereafter but it will cause
the Muslims to become
closer and caring, such
that Rasulullah ﷺ
described the close
relationship between a

**Muslim and another as if
they are one body.**

**an-Nu'maan bin Basheer
*radhiyAllaahu'anhuma***

reported that Rasulullah

**صلى الله
عليه وسلم said:**

“The believers in their

**mutual kindness, compassion
and sympathy are just like
one body. When one of the
limbs suffers, the whole body
responds to it with
wakefulness and fever”**

(Agreed Upon)

“And whoever desires other than Islam as religion - never will it be accepted from him, and he, in the Hereafter, will be among the losers.”

(Aal-‘Imraan 3:85)

**consequences will only
disrupt the harmony, unity,
and security of the Muslim
ummah and our nation.
Extremism will only give
negative impression upon
the nobility and holiness of
al-Islam. On the contrary, the
Muslim**

**ummah must inculcate noble
akhlaaq, having utmost
personality and attitude as
true Muslims so that the
world will know that
Rasulullah (ﷺ) was sent
down as a messenger, and
Islam that was revealed is
mercy**



**for the entire
nation and
universe.**

O Allah, You are the Lord that is All Mighty, we are grateful to You for having bestowed upon us *rahmah* and *ni'mah*, that we are able to continue the effort in empowering the Muslim *ummah* especially in Selangor, as an

**advanced state, prosperous,
and providing welfare.**

**Hence, we sincerely beseech
you, O Allah, strengthen our
imaan, accept our deeds,
strengthen our unity,
increase our *rizq*, enrich us
with**

**beneficial knowledge,
cultivate our soul with good
mannerisms, return us to the
path that you are pleased
with, protect us from disasters
and your severe trials, so that
our nation will become more
peaceful and filled with
blessings.**

O Allah, we sincerely beseech you, strengthen our beliefs according to the creed of *Ahlu Sunnah wal-Jamaa'ah*, and protect us from deeds and *'aqeedah* that are astray such as the extreme *Shee'is*, *Qadiyani*, and other ideologies.
