Let us strive to increase our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala with full certainty and sincerity, by fulfilling all of His Commands and avoiding all of His

prohibitions. Verily, we truly hope to become those having imaan and taqwa, attaining salvation and blissfulness in this world and the Hereafter.

On this blessed Friday, let us listen and internalize upon a khutbah entitled: "Righteous Children – The Parents' Vital Asset."

As we all know, children are precious gifts and amaanah from Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. It is an amaanah that is an obligation and responsibility that must be fulfilled in the best way.

Children must be protected, raised, educated, and given all of their due rights, so that they will become righteous children and beneficial in this world and the Hereafter. From this we should realize

that only righteous children can provide benefit to their parents whether in this world or the Hereafter. The rank of those parents, who were successful in raising their children unto becoming

righteous, will always rise in the Hereafter. It will be announced by Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala that such elevated rank is due to the du'aa of their righteous children.

## Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu 'anh reported: Rasulullah عليه وسلم said: "When a man dies, his deeds come to an end, except for three: A continuous charity,

## knowledge by which people derive benefit, pious son who prays for him."

(Muslim)

From here, it is evident that righteous children are vital assets to the parents in

determining the blissfulness of life whether in this world or the Hereafter. The obedient or righteous children are those having solid imaan and 'ageedah, always having the taqwa of

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala, always engaging in 'ibaadah, always respecting their parents and others, possessing noble akhlaaq, having religious consciousness, works hard

and placing tawakkul in Allah Subhaanahu Wata'aala, always making du'aa for their parents, and serving their parents whether they are still alive or deceased.

When we look at the current situation of Muslim society today, we find that the relationship between parents and children are becoming more distant. There are children that no longer

respect their parents. They do not want to listen to their parents' advice, and even more saddening, there are those that have no qualm in physically assaulting their own parents, suing them in

court, sending them off to elderly care, and even murdering their own parents. This is a manifestation of severe moral decline plaguing the children, and if it is to be left as is, it will

cause rupture to the family institution, society, and nation. The question now is what is the root cause for all of that? Who should shoulder the blame? Some actually placed the blame

upon the children and continue to punish them with various labels such as anak derhaka (rebellious child), ungrateful children, and others. Others would place the blame upon the parents

for not fulfilling their responsibilities upon their children.

In this regard, we should not point fingers and blame any particular sides. What is important is that we perform

self-muhaasabah (selfreflection) upon our own selves, for each of them have their rights and obligations, as well as responsibilities. Therefore, the parents especially must fulfill their

responsibilities and obligations upon their children based on what has been stipulated by the Sharee 'ah. Similarly, the children also must fulfill their obligations and

responsibilities towards their parents so that they will become children that are righteous and beneficial in this world and the Hereafter.

The very obligation and responsibility in the effort of rearing and grooming righteous children are shouldered upon the parents, for every child is born into this world in a clean and

pure state, free from internal impurities and affiliations. The offspring is regarded as a white cloth that can be decorated by the parents with any color they want.

The main obligation for the parents in the effort of raising righteous children is providing education especially sound Islamic knowledge. Hence, every parents are obligated and

responsible in fulfilling this duty, for only with sufficient and complete Islamic education that the children becomes fit to wade through life challenges and saving themselves from falling into

various social evils such stealing, drug abuse, consuming intoxicants, gambling, and many other activities that clearly contradicts the Sharee 'ah.

Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an: "O you who have believed, protect yourselves and your families from a Fire whose fuel is people and

stones, over which are [appointed] angels, harsh and severe; they do not disobey Allah in what He commands them but do what they are commanded."

(at-Tahreem 66:6)

We must realize that the parents, having the status as leaders or head of the family, are obligated and responsible in creating an Islamic environment within the family, which is by

practicing or inculcating Islamic teachings conveyed by Rasulullah عليه وسلم such as praying in congregation, having meals together, reciting al-Qur'an regularly, spreading the salaam

(greetings), and many others. The parents are obligated to monitor the children, especially in their socialization with their peers, for the children's heart and behavior are easily

influenced by their peers. A good company will leave a positive impact and develops the children to become good. On the contrary, a bad company will leave a negative impact and destroys

the children's personality. Furthermore, the parents must always take great care and monitor their children, even admonishing them if they display improper behavior and conduct,

what more with matters that clearly contradicts the *Sharee 'ah*.

The children also have obligations and responsibilities toward their parents. They must always

obey their parents and respect them all the time. It is forbidden for the children to utter unpleasant words that can offend their parents. It is waajib upon the children to care and provide support

to their parents in their late age. The responsibility of the children upon their parents is actually a command to serve and do good to the parents, mentioned together with the command to worship and

## perform 'ibaadah to Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala. Allah Subhaanahu Wata 'aala mentions in al-Qur'an:

#### "Worship Allah and associate nothing with Him, and to parents do good..."

(an-Nisaa' 4:36)

As lessons and reflections derived from this khutbah: 1- The Muslim ummah must effectively educate their children, consistent with Islamic teachings.

- 2- The parents must become good exemplary for their children.
- 3- The parents must monitor their children's actions and activities so as to prevent them from falling into

### disobedience and criminal activities.

4- The parents must remain open upon receiving news or reports regarding their children.

5- Treat the children like best friends, in creating a family atmosphere that is filled with peace and harmony.

"And those who believed and whose descendants followed them in faith - We will join with them their descendants, and We will not deprive

# them of anything of their deeds. Every person, for what he earned, is retained."

(at-Toor 52:21)

### for the entire nation and universe.

O Allah, You are the Lord that is All Mighty, we are grateful to You for having bestowed upon us rahmah and ni'mah, that we are able to continue the effort in empowering the Muslim ummah especially in Selangor, as an

advanced state, prosperous, and providing welfare.

Hence, we sincerely beseech you, O Allah, strengthen our imaan, accept our deeds, strengthen our unity, increase our rizq, enrich us with

beneficial knowledge, cultivate our soul with good mannerisms, return us to the path that you are pleased with, protect us from disasters and your severe trials, so that our nation will become more peaceful and filled with blessings.

O Allah, we sincerely beseech you, strengthen our beliefs according to the creed of Ahlus Sunnah wal-Jamaa'ah, and protect us from deeds and 'ageedah that are astray such as the extreme Shee'is, Qadiyani, and other ideologies.
