let us reflect upon a khutbah titled



In discussing this topic, let us examine the glory of al-Qur'an that was mentioned by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in al-Qur'an and explained odds an adds and add various ahaadeeth.

1. Al-Qur'an as the proof of truth and guidance from Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. This was mentioned by Allah in verse 174 of soorah an-Nisaa':

"O mankind, there has come to you a conclusive proof from your Lord, and We have sent down to you a clear light."

2. Al-Quran as the undisputed guidance for mankind. It is the Word of **Allah that is Most Supreme.** This was mentioned by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in the first and second

verse of soorah al-Baqarah:

"Alif, Lam, Meem. This is the Book about which there is no doubt, a guidance for those conscious of Allah."

This was also explained صلى الله ohy the Prophet عليه وسلم, as mentioned in the hadeeth of Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu صلى الله (anh, where he عليه وسلم) said:

"The virtue of al-Qur'an over the speech of others is like the virtue of Allah over His creation." (at-Tirmidhi)

3. Al-Quran is a book that is Lofty and it is the Word of Allah that is **Heavy and Glorious.** This was explained by Allah in verse 21 of soorah al-Hashr:

"If We had sent down this Qur'an upon a mountain, you would have seen it humbled and coming apart from fear of Allah..."

as-Shaykh Dr. Wahbah az-**Zuhailiy explained in** Tafseer al-Muneer that if Allah had revealed al-Qur'an upon a mountain that is similar to humans, in which Allah has bestowed the intellect,

having the ability to think and differentiate between the truth (al-haqq) and falsehood (al-baatil), then the mountains would have cleft asunder due to khushoo' (humility) and fear of Allah. Elsewhere,

Allah depicted al-Qur'an as a heavy word, as mentioned in verse 5 of soorah al-Muzzammil:

"Indeed, We will cast upon you a heavy word."

According to ibn Katheer, "a heavy word" in this verse refers to the commandments that must be adhered to and practiced. Or it could also mean as heavy words due to it being Kalaamullaah

(Speech of Allah). al-**Imaam Ahmad narrated a** hadeeth from Sayyidatina 'A'ishah radiyAllaahu 'anha that one time when صلى الله Basulullah صلى الله was receiving the wahy (revelation) while seated

on his camel, the camel had immediately sat down on the ground due to the weight of the revelation received.

4. Al-Qur'an is a book that is magnificent and unparalleled. Hence, Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala had challenged mankind to invent something similar to al-Qur'an, even if it just

equivalent to the shortest soorah (chapter). Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 23 of soorah al-Bagarah:

"And if you are in doubt about what We have sent down upon Our Servant [Muhammad], then produce a surah the like thereof and call upon your witnesses other than Allah, if you should be truthful."

In another verse, Allah had put forth a challenge upon all creations, jinn and mankind, to produce something similar to al-Qur'an. Allah mentions in verse 88 of soorah al-Israa':

"Say, "If mankind and the jinn gathered in order to produce the like of this Qur'an, they could not produce the like of it, even if they were to each other assistants.""

5. Al-Qur'an is a book that is guaranteed of its preservation throughout the ages. This was mentioned in verse 9 of soorah al-Hijr:

"Indeed, it is We who sent down the Qur'an and indeed, We will be its guardian."

In this verse, Allah had promised to safeguard

al-Qur'an from being changed and altered, as it was done unto the scriptures of previous nations. Those scriptures had been tampered all over that it

became difficult to ascertain its authenticity.

If we were to ask, how should we behave and act towards al-Qur'an? Would it suffice to render al-Qur'an as decorations on

the walls of our homes, masaajid and suraus? The answer would be: Of course not, because when we already possess and have certainty upon the glory of al-Qur'an, then the most important

thing for us is to love that book with utmost interest in learning its recitation, delving into its contents, practicing upon the **commandments** decreed within, and spreading its teachings to others

especially our family members whom are our dependents.

صلى الله عليه وسلم promised incredible rewards from Allah

Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala for those that learn al-Qur'an, as mentioned in the hadeeth of Abu Dharr radiyAllaahu 'anh, صلى الله where Rasulullah عليه وسلم had said to him:

"O Abu Dharr! For you to come out in the morning and learn one verse from the Book of Allah is better for you than praying one hundred rak'ah..."

(ibn Maajah)

Before ending the *khutbah* today, let us derive several lessons from today's *khutbah*:

1. The Muslim *ummah* must have certainty and belief that it is *waajib*

(obligatory) to embrace al-Qur'an as the manual and guidance in our lives. It is a great miracle bestowed upon our **beloved** Prophet صلى الله Muhammad عليه وسلم

2. It should become common upon the Muslim ummah to learn and comprehend al-Qur'an, furthermore in practicing all of the teachings within it.

3. It is waajib upon the Muslim ummah to spread the teachings of al-Qur'an, at the very least to its dependents.

4. The Muslim ummahis reminded to not become heedless and negligent from ensuring that its children are instilled with the education of al-Qur'an.

5. The Muslim ummahis reminded to not abandon or sideline al-Qur'an in wading through the daily affairs in this life.

"Has the time not come for those who have believed that their hearts should become humbly submissive at the remembrance of Allah and what has come down of the truth? And let them

not be like those who were given the Scripture before, and a long period passed over them, so their hearts hardened; and many of them are defiantly disobedient." (al-Hadeed 51:16)



THE SECOND KHUTBAH



Once again, I would like to remind all of us to always have the taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala and realize that Islam teaches us to remain moderate in every actions and



deeds. As Muslims, we are to manifest noble *akhlaaq*, having utmost personality and attitude or Rasulullah صلى الله was sent to عليه وسلم perfect akhlaaq and as mercy for the entire mankind and the worlds. Therefore, let us



always increase our salawaat and salaam upon our Prophet Muhammad صلى الله Allah عليه وسلم Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala **mentions:**



"Indeed, Allah confers blessing upon the Prophet, and His angels [ask Him to do so]. O you who have believed, ask [Allah to confer] blessing upon him and ask [Allah to grant him] peace." (al-Ahzaab 33:56)



O Allah, You are the Lord that is All Mighty, we are grateful to You for having bestowed upon us rahmah and ni'mah, that we are able to continue the effort in empowering the Muslim ummah, as an advanced state,



prosperous and providing welfare, under the auspices and leadership of our Ruler as the Head of Islamic affairs in this state.



Hence, we sincerely beseech You, O Allah, strengthen our imaan and creed according to that of Ahl as-Sunnah wal-Jamaa'ah, accept our righteous deeds, cultivate our soul with good mannerisms, unite our



hearts, bestow upon us rizg with blessings, enrich us with beneficial knowledge, protect us from disasters and save us from teachings that are outside the fold of Islam such as Qadiyaani, deviant teachings such as



Shee'ah, and other teachings deemed as deviating from **Islamic teachings or** contradicting the creed of Ahl as-Sunnah wal-Jamaa'ah. 0 Allah, open up our hearts in performing the five daily
