

I remind myself and fellow audience to strive in increasing our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala by fulfilling all of His Commands, and avoiding all of His

له الرحم الرحيـ

prohibitions, as well as upholding the amaanah (trust) that has been entrusted upon us, which will be accounted for in the Hereafter. Verily, preserving and fulfilling the amaanah

appropriately is from among the major requirements in solidifying our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala.

The war drum is beating **louder and the banners** have been raised high. On the 9th of May, it is incumbent upon us to come out and cast our vote in choosing the leader that will determine

the future direction of our nation for the next five years. Hence, let us internalize upon a khutbah titled "THE DUTY OF SELECTING OUR LEADER."

Why are we obligated to select a leader?

First: Choosing a leader is from among the requirements in Islam. In the hadeeth of Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu 'anh,

صلى الله Basulullah عليه وسلم said:

"When three are on a journey, they should appoint one of them as their commander." (Abu Dawood)

This hadeeth clearly explains the importance of appointing a leader, even if it is just amongst three individuals. This is to ensure that there will be harmonized understandings in the

lives of the Muslims. Not to mention, in a nation that has a population of **30 million people. Definitely it is vital to be** implemented.

The selection of a leader is a form of testimony that must be fulfilled and will be held accountable **before** Allah in the Hereafter. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 282 of

soorah al-Baqarah:

"... And let not the witnesses refuse when they are called *upon..."*

Based on the hadeeth and verse mentioned, it is clear that choosing a leader is a responsibility, what more when there are many offering themselves to become leaders. Therefore, it is

incumbent upon us to select the best leader that will bring benefit to the religion, society, nation, and the Muslim ummah as a whole.

Second: We are obligated to select our leader because of our endeavor in appointing the best leader. Al-Qur'an mentions to us several characteristics of a good leader that is capable of

upholding the religion and administers the world with sound religious understanding. Among the characteristics of a good leader is one that is knowledgeable, ablebodied, physically fit, and

possessing high integrity. These traits can be found in the personality of Nabi Moosa 'alayhissalaam, Nabi Yoosuf 'alayhissalaam, and Taa-Loot the Commander, when they were all given

the responsibility. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions regarding Nabi Moosa 'alayhissalaam in verse 26 of soorah al-Qasas:

"One of the women said, "O my father, hire him. Indeed, the best one you can hire is the strong and the trustworthy.""

Allah mentions regarding the selection of Taa-Loot as a leader that is capable and knowledgeable in verse 247 of soorah al-**Baqarah**:

"Their prophet said to them, "Indeed, Allah has chosen him over you and has increased him abundantly in knowledge and stature.""

Regarding the leadership of Nabi Yoosuf 'alayhissalaam, Allah mentions in verse 55 of soorah Yoosuf:

"[Joseph] said, "Appoint me over the storehouses of the land. Indeed, I will be a knowing guardian.""

Even though our nation grants us the liberty in choosing a leader, we are obligated to choose a leader that is knowledgeable, having integrity, and capable of bringing prosperity to the

religion, citizen, and nation. Ibn 'Abbaas radiyAllaahu 'anhuma narrated that Rasulullah صلى الله Said: عليه وسلم "If one [in charge of Muslim affairs] appoints one from a group,

while there is another [in the group] who can be more pleasing to Allah than the appointed one, he has betrayed Allah, His Messenger and the believers."

(al-Haakim)

This hadeeth coincides with the severe prohibition from Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala to the believers to not even once betray Allah and His Messenger, as mentioned in verse 27 of soorah al-Anfaal:

"O you who have believed, do not betray Allah and the Messenger or betray your trusts while you know [the consequence]."

Islam truly emphasize on the matter of akhlaaq even when facing the enemies in the battlefield. Hence, it is even further emphasized when it comes to competing in democratic elections.

The democratic system itself was established so that the people can compete in assuming authority peacefully, without having to resort to physical coercion or weaponry. What is

provided is the opportunity for everyone to present their arguments and explain their manifestos.

Therefore, every candidate and their

coalitions must observe their very adab (mannerism) while campaigning. Just because of our support to a particular candidate and his or her group, let us not become hostile

and strangers with one another.

Let us not deceive or slander, provoke, and hurl abusive words that may offend others while on the campaign trail. Such

strategy truly contradicts the utmost characteristic of a leader, which is honesty. Even though this may be deemed as trivial, it is a grave sin in the Sight of Allah. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala

mentions in verse 15 of soorah an-Noor:

"When you received it with your tongues and said with your mouths that of which

you had no knowledge and thought it was insignificant while it was, in the sight of Allah, tremendous."

In concluding this khutbah, we can summarize several lessons for our internalization as **Muslims, among them:**

1. The Muslim ummah must have imaan and certainty that in the Hereafter, Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala will hold all of our deeds and actions accountable, including the duty of selecting our leader.

2. The Muslim ummah must always safeguard its akhlaaq as upright Muslims throughout the election period.

3. The Muslim ummah must select a leader possessing integrity, knowledge, and competency in shouldering the responsibility that can

bring prosperity to the nation, so that it is spared from calamities and disasters in this life.

"Corruption has appeared throughout the land and sea by [reason of] what the hands of people have earned so He may let them taste part of

[the consequence of] what they have done that perhaps they will return [to righteousness]." (ar-Room 30:41)



THE SECOND KHUTBAH



Once again, I would like to remind all of us to always have the taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala and realize that Islam teaches us to remain moderate in every actions and



deeds. As Muslims, we are to manifest noble akhlaaq, having utmost personality and attitude or Rasulullah صلى الله was sent to عليه وسلم perfect akhlaaq and as mercy for the entire mankind and the worlds. Therefore, let us



always increase our salawaat and salaam upon our Prophet Muhammad صلى الله Allah عليه وسلم Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala **mentions:**



"Indeed, Allah confers blessing upon the Prophet, and His angels [ask Him to do so]. O you who have believed, ask [Allah to confer] blessing upon him and ask [Allah to grant him] peace." (al-Ahzaab 33:56)



O Allah, You are the Lord that is All Mighty, we are grateful to You for having bestowed upon us rahmah and ni'mah, that we are able to continue the effort in empowering the Muslim ummah, as an advanced state,



prosperous and providing welfare, under the auspices and leadership of our Ruler as the Head of Islamic affairs in this state.



Hence, we sincerely beseech You, O Allah, strengthen our imaan and creed according to that of Ahl as-Sunnah wal-Jamaa'ah, accept our righteous deeds, cultivate our soul with good mannerisms, unite our



hearts, bestow upon us rizg with blessings, enrich us with beneficial knowledge, protect us from disasters and save us from teachings that are outside the fold of Islam such as Qadiyaani, deviant teachings such as



Shee'ah, and other teachings deemed as deviating from **Islamic teachings or** contradicting the creed of Ahl as-Sunnah wal-Jamaa'ah. 0 Allah, open up our hearts in performing the five daily



prayers, fulfilling zakaat through the Selangor Zakaat Board, making waqf and infaaq of our wealth to Selangor Waqf **Corporation and Islamic Development Trust Fund of** Selangor.

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
