His Commands and avoiding all of His prohibitions. With that, may we always remain bestowed with the pleasure and mercy of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala.

Today, I solemnly invite fellow congregation to internalize upon a *khutbah* titled



Every Friday of the week we would convene at the masjid, engaging in various deeds such as performing charity (sadaqah), listening to the khutbah, praying and making i'tikaaf in the

masjid, reciting al-Qur'an, and others. Even then, many are still negligent and heedless, as well as ignoring the honor that Allah as bestowed upon the day of Friday. For example, some of us

would deliberately come to the masjid really late, engaging in idle talk, and even when the khutbah is being delivered there are those that are either dozing off or twiddling with their mobile phones.

And even more saddening is that there are those out there that do not even attend the Friday prayer and even blatantly ignores it. Do we even know how noble is the day of Friday in the

sight of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala? Perhaps many of us are well-informed and aware that Friday is the chief of all days, it is the day that **Prophet Adam** 'Alayhissalaam was

created, the day that Prophet Adam was made to enter Paradise and taken out of Paradise, and the Day of Judgment will not occur except on a Friday. Such privilege and honor for the day of Friday that the rising of the sun on a

Friday that the rising of the sun on a Friday is the best sunrise compared to other days. This was mentioned in the hadeeth of Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu 'anh, where Rasulullah said:

"The best day on which the sun has risen is Friday; on it Adam was created. On it he was made to enter Paradise, on it he was expelled from it. And the Last Hour will take place on no day other than Friday."

(Muslim)

Verily, the day of Friday is a great day for the Muslim ummah. Allah has honored Friday over both 'Eid al-Fitr and 'Eid al-Adha. However, there are those that are still heedless by neglecting it

while all other creations are in fear of the day of Friday. In the narration of Abu Lubaabah bin 'Abdul Mundhir radiyAllaahu 'anh, Rasulullah said:

"Friday is the chief of days, the greatest day before Allah. It is greater before Allah then the Day of Adha and the Day of Fitr. It has five characteristics: On it Allah created Adam;

on it Allah sent down Adam to this earth; on it there is a time during which a person does not ask Allah for anything but He will give it to him, so long as he does not ask for anything that is

forbidden; on it the Hour will begin. There is no angel who is close to Allah, no heaven, no earth, no wind, no mountain, and no sea that does not fear Friday." (ibn Maajah and Ahmad)

In this worldly life, no human being would want to lose out, if the opportunity to reap profit is wide open before his eyes. Moreover, if possible, human beings would hope for the

opportunity in garnering benefits to always come so that they can continuously take advantage of such golden opportunity. Similarly, that is the case with regard to the virtues

regarding Friday. On every Friday, beginning from the sunset of the previous day, namely Thursday, up until the time of Maghrib, every Muslim regardless whether young or old,

male or female, will have the very opportunity to reap multitude of rewards provided by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala on the day of Friday. Among the virtues of Friday that we usually

ignore is the period in which du'aas (supplications) are accepted by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. Abu Burdah bin Abi Moosa al-Ash'ari radiyAllaahu 'anh

reported: 'Abdullah ibn 'Umar *radiyAllaahu* 'anhuma said to me:

"Did you hear anything from your father narrating something from the Messenger of Allah (**)

about the time on Friday?" I said: "Yes, I heard him say from the Messenger of Allah () (these words): "It is between the time when the Imam sits down and the end of the prayer."" (Muslim)

Similarly with the hadeeth of Jaabir bin **'Abdillaah** radiyAllaahu 'anh that: the Prophet said:

"Friday is twelve hours in which there is no Muslim slave who asks Allah for something but He will give it to him, so seek it in the last hour after 'Asr."

(an-Nasaa'i)

The hadeeth mentioned just now clearly indicated the time period in which supplications are answered (mustajab) on Friday. As slaves of Allah having many weaknesses and shortcomings,

definitely we have lots of need and du'aas to be answered by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. But what a great loss that with such great opportunity given

on a Friday, and yet we would decorate it with heedlessness and unbeneficial deeds.

Therefore, let us make it a habit to immerse in the sunnah acts of Friday such as performing wudoo'with perfection and ghusl (bath) before heading out to the masjid, putting on nice fragrance,

coming to the masjid early, increase our recitation of al-Qur'an, cutting our nails, and other supererogatory acts. In the hadeeth of Salman al-Faarisee radiy Allaahu 'anh, Rasulullah said:

"Whoever takes a bath on Friday, purifies himself as much as he can, then uses his (hair) oil or perfumes himself with the scent of his house, then proceeds (for the Jumu'ah prayer)

and does not separate two persons sitting together (in the mosque), then prays as much as (Allah has) written for him and then remains silent while the

Imam is delivering the khutbah, his sins inbetween the present and the last Friday would be forgiven."

(al-Bukhaari)

Aside from that, we have been commanded to increase our salawaat on Friday. This was stated in the hadeeth of Aws bin Aws radiyAllaahu 'anh, where Rasulullah said:

"One of the best of your days is Friday. On this day, Adam was created and on this day he died, on this day the Trumpet will be blown, and on this day all creatures will swoon. So send a great

deal of salaah [peace and blessings] upon me on this day, for your salaah will be presented to me." They said: "O Messenger of Allah (), how will our salaah be presented to you when you have

decomposed (after death)?" He said: "Allah, the Mighty and Sublime, has forbidden the earth to consume the bodies of the prophets, peace be upon them."

(Abu Dawood, an-Nasaa'i, ibn Maajah)

We are also encouraged to come to the masjid as early as possible so that we can perform the supererogatory prayer with tranquility, as well as finding a suitable spot to sit. Moreover, those

arriving early, their names will be written down by the angels stationed at the doors of the masjid. These angels will stop recording the names once the adhaan is pronounced.

In the *hadeeth* of Abu Hurayrah *radiyAllaahu* 'anh, Rasulullah ﷺ said:

"On every Friday the angels take their stand at every gate of the mosque to write the names of the

people chronologically (i.e. according to the time of their arrival for the Friday prayer) and when the Imam sits (on the pulpit) they fold up their scrolls and get ready to listen to the sermon."

(al-Bukhaari)

In addition to these virtues, there are several matters that must be given due attention so that the rewards that we are striving for will not render in vain. While in the masjid, we must

observe proper adab (etiquette) and maintain its serene atmosphere. Moreover, we have been reminded by Rasulullah to not indulge in idle acts while the khateeb is delivering the khutbah.

This was mentioned in the hadeeth of Abu Hurayrah radiyAllaahu 'anh, where Rasulullah said:

"If you say to your companions: 'Be quiet' on a Friday while the Imam is delivering the sermon, you have engaged in Laghw (idle talk or behavior)." (ibn Maajah) Take note, dear respected audience, that even reprimanding others by saying 'be quiet' our deeds are rendered in vain. So imagine if we would be talking or engaging in idle

conversation in the back and outside the masjid? Do we not realize then how our presence today is of no avail?

To end the khutbah, there are several important matters that we can derive as lessons and reflections. Among them:

1. The Muslim ummah must duly realize and have certainty with penitence that Friday is a day that is full of barakah from

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. That even the Day of Judgment will take place on a Friday.


2. The Muslim ummah must hasten to seize every opportunity and rewards from the various deeds that conforms to the Sharee 'ah on Friday.

3. The Muslim ummah must strive to make its day better than the previous ones, so as to become an ummah that is excellent and successful.

"Say, [O Muhammad], "Shall we [believers] inform you of the greatest losers as to [their] deeds? [They are] those whose effort is lost in worldly life, while they think that they are doing well in work."" (al-Kahf 18:103-104)







