

حرالته الرحمر الرحيب I remind myself and fellow audience that let us strive in increasing our imaan and taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala by remaining steadfast in performing all of His

Commands, and avoiding all of His prohibitions. May we become among those having utmost taqwa by attaining blissfulness in this world and the Hereafter.

Today, I solemnly invite fellow congregation to internalize upon a *khutbah* titled



#bahagian pengurusan masjid

As the slaves of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala, we have been commanded to have imaan and worship unto Him. We have to fulfill the commands of

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala with istiqaamah (steadfastness) as in the verse mentioned earlier, verse 112 of Soorah Hood, which means:

"So remain on a right course as you have been commanded, [you] and those who have turned back with you [to Allah], and do not transgress. Indeed, He is Seeing of what you do."

In the hadeeth of Sufyaan bin 'Abdullah radiyAllaahu 'anh, Rasulullah عليه وسلم said:

"Say I affirm my faith in Allah and then remain steadfast to it." (Muslim) Among the commands of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala that requires us to have istigaamah in fulfilling them are:

First: Performing salaah during the prescribed times for salaah is an obligation that must be fulfilled by the believers during its prescribed times. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions

in verse 103 of soorah an-Nisaa':

"Indeed, prayer has been decreed upon the believers a decree of specified times."

For those that are neglectful and heedless with regard to their salaah, Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala has given stern warning with severe torment, as He mentions in verse 59 of

## soorah Maryam:

"But there came after them successors who neglected prayer and pursued desires; so they are going to meet evil."

Rasulullah عليه وسلم had reminded his ummah to not neglect salaah as in the narration of Jaabir bin 'Abdullah radiyAllaahu 'anhuma, where he عليه وسلم said:

"Between man and polytheism and unbelief is the abandonment of salaah."

(Muslim)

This shows the great importance in preserving and safeguarding our salaah. It is for that reason that Sayyidina 'Umar radiyAllaahu 'anh

would always firmly emphasize on the obligation of salaah to the officers under his command.

Second: To seek knowledge. Seeking knowledge is an obligation that falls upon every Muslim, through teachers whom are acknowledged and recognized in their

scholarship, not merely seeking knowledge without a teacher. Moreover, we are to seek knowledge so that we would always remain on the path of truth, and that we can also guide other

Muslims together. The importance of seeking knowledge and teaching others has been recorded by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala through His Words, mentioned in verse 122 of

## Soorah at-Tawbah:

"And it is not for the believers to go forth [to battle] all at once. For there should separate from every division of

them a group [remaining] to obtain understanding in the religion and warn their people when they return to them that they might be cautious."

For those striving in seeking knowledge, there are favors bestowed by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala upon them. Rasulullah عليه وسلم had reminded us in the hadeeth of Abu Hurayrah

radiyAllaahu 'anh where he ملليالله said:

"And whoever follows a path to seek knowledge therein, Allah will make easy for him a path to Paradise." (Muslim)

Virtues are also bestowed upon those seeking the knowledge of al-Qur'an and teaches it to others, as mentioned in the hadeeth of 'Uthmaan radiyAllaahu 'anh, where Rasulullah عليه وسلم said:

"The best among you (Muslims) are those who learn the Qur'an and teach it."

(al-Bukhaari)

Seeking knowledge has no end. For as long as the soul is breathing, the journey in seeking knowledge will continue further. Let us take valuable lessons from this story. A prominent Muslim

scholar that is well known named Abu Rayhaan al-Birooni was very ill but he would still sought for answers regarding figh (jurisprudence) questions from his companions that visited him. With a sad

tone, his friend asked: "Is this a suitable time for me to ask such questions?" al-Birooni answered with firmness: "I will not leave this world without having the knowledge pertaining those questions."

The opportunity for us to remain istiqaamah in seeking knowledge is wide open with various programs organized by various quarters. Among them, the masjid and surau committee are

offering knowledgebased activities every single day. Aside from that, we are also encouraged to increase our knowledge by reading, as in the command of Allah

Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in the opening verse of soorah al-'Alaq. Hence, let us embrace the habit of reading and frequent the circles of knowledge, especially ones organized by the masjid committee

as part of our daily activities.

Third: Covering the 'awrah. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala has commanded His believing slaves to cover their 'awrah in preserving their dignity and selfrespect especially for the women. The command to cover the 'awrah and its boundaries for a woman can be found in verse 31 of soorah an-Noor:

"And tell the believing women to reduce [some] of their vision and guard their private parts and not expose their adornment except

that which [necessarily] appears thereof and to wrap [a portion of] their head covers over their chests ..."

ibn 'Abbaas radiyAllaahu 'anhuma and 'A'ishah radiyAllaahu 'anha explained that the term zhahir (exposed) in this verse refers to the face and both palms. The 'awrah for women has

been further explained by al-Imaam ash-Shaafi'i in his book al-Umm, which covers the entire body except for the face and the palms. With this simple explanation, we can then comprehend

the limits of 'awrah for a woman.

Nowadays, there are many Muslim women that have made "hijrah" in fulfilling the command of Allah Subhaanahu Wa

Ta'aala. Some used to not cover their 'awrah in the past but now have began covering their 'awrah with perfection and fully veiled (hijaab). This is definitely something to be proud of.

However, there are some Muslim women that unfortunately manipulated the issue of covering the 'awrah as a plaything. Some of them began to wear the hijaab but would later take it off

and not wear the hijaab anymore, just to blend in with the current "trend". It is as if they are tinkering with the commands of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. Such is the case when

one succumbs to the *nafs* (desire) in this worldly life.

Similarly with the men whom are also not exempted and excepted from the ruling of

covering their 'awrah. Therefore, let us altogether remain determined and steadfast in fulfilling the commandments of Allah and avoid all of

His prohibitions at all times, wherever we may be. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 6 of soorah at-Tahreem:

"O you who have believed, protect yourselves and your families from a Fire whose fuel is people and stones, over which are [appointed] angels,

harsh and severe; they do not disobey Allah in what He commands them but do what they are commanded."

To end the khutbah today, I would like to remind all of us to take valuable lessons upon the following:

1. The Muslim ummah must have belief in Allah and His Messenger, as well as performing all of His Commands that was sent down through His Messenger.

2. The Muslim ummah must continue to remain istiqaamah in fulfilling all of the commands of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala, for it is from among the practices of Islamic akhlaaq (morals).

3. The Muslim ummah must safeguard itself and everyone within its responsibility so as to not become influenced with lifestyles that contradicts authentic Islamic teachings.


4. The Muslim ummah must have certainty that every deeds performed will be held accountable and rewarded accordingly by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in the Hereafter.

(al-Zalzalah 99:7-8)


## THE SECOND KHUTBAH





