I remind myself and fellow respected audience that let us strengthen our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala with absolute

taqwa, by performing all of His Commands and avoiding all of His prohibitions. May we all attain blissfulness in this world and the Hereafter.

Today I will be delivering a khutbah titled

Let us imagine that we are all in the same boat right in the middle of the vast ocean without any guidance, and not to mention the violent waves pounding. How would our situation be at that

very moment? Definitely we would lose our sense of direction through the rough seas.

Such assumption can be easily comprehended

with those turbulent waves representing the onslaughts by the enemies of Islam that will drown us. The guidance that we truly need is Islamic Sharee 'ah that will guide us out of

the rough seas.

Islam is a religion that guides mankind out of ignorance unto the path of truth. History has witnessed the

messengership of Rasulullah in spreading the risaalah (message) of Islam to the pagan (jaahiliyyah) Arab society. Its purpose is none other than to guide them out of the shackles of

ignorance to the truth. As a religion that brings truth, all of its teachings are enshrined in the holy book of al-Qur'an. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 9 of soorah al-Israa':

"Indeed, this Qur'an guides to that which is most suitable and gives good tidings to the believers who do righteous deeds that they will have a great reward." This holy scripture was revealed to Rasulullah and it is his very duty to explain it to all mankind. In addition to al-Qur'an, as-Sunnah also serves as guidance in religious living. It carries the

role of explaining the verses of al-Qur'an. Hence, both al-Qur'an and as-Sunnah serve as the primary source and reference for the Muslim ummah in

wading through their lives as true Muslims. The significance of clinging upon the teachings of al-Qur'an and as-Sunnah of Rasulullah was

mentioned by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in al-Qur'an, through verse 92 of soorah al-Maa'idah:

"And obey Allah and obey the Messenger and beware. And if you turn away - then know that upon Our Messenger is only [the responsibility for] clear notification."

It is crystal clear for us that al-Qur'an and as-Sunnah are the primary sources and reference for the Muslim ummah. However, nowadays, there are Muslims that are influenced by teachings

that clearly contradicts Islamic teachings. Among them is the teaching that attempts to liberate oneself from the bond of Shara' and glorifying the law of reason ('aql) over revelation (naql).

In reality, al-Qur'an advocates that mankind utilizes its intellectual capability to ponder upon the Oneness and power of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. There are many verses in al-Qur'an

that instruct the humans to utilize their intellectual faculties. Among them is where Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 190 of soorah Aal-'Imraan:

"Indeed, in the creation of the heavens and the earth and the alternation of the night and the day are signs for those of understanding."

However, the limited 'aql cannot comprehend matters pertaining to the Unseen such as albarzakh (life after death) and aakhirah (Hereafter). Therefore, it is religion that will guide

the 'aqlin understanding and detailing on matters regarding 'aqeedah, akhlaaq, and Sharee 'ah rulings. The intellect that is guided by religion will be able to filter every news and information

received from the Internet, what more in comprehending matters relating to the rulings in Islam, so that every action and decision undertaken will not deviate and mislead us.

To properly comprehend Islamic teachings, it behoove us to refer to the explanations by the 'ulamaa' (scholars) so that we will not deviate from the actual intended meaning, especially

when it pertains to the commandments from Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 43 of soorah an-Nahl:

"So ask the people of the message if you do not know."

Rasulullah had also explained the role of the 'ulamaa' in the narration of Abu ad-Dardaa' radiyAllaahu 'anh, where he said:

"Indeed the scholars are the heirs of the Prophets, and the Prophets do not leave behind Dinar or Dirham. The only

legacy of the scholars is knowledge, so whoever takes from it, then he has indeed taken an abundant portion."

(at-Tirmidhi)

To conclude the khutbah and that we attain the pleasure of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala, let us derive lessons upon the following:

1. The Muslim ummah must have certainty that al-Qur'an and as-Sunnah serve as the ultimate guide in attaining divine pleasure.

2. The Muslim ummah must refer to learned scholars in understanding the teachings of al-Qur'an and as-Sunnah.

3. The Muslim ummah must always remain vigilant upon pluralism and liberal thinking that clearly contradicts al-Qur'an and as-Sunnah.

"And whoever opposes the Messenger after guidance has become clear to him and follows other than the way of the believers -

We will give him what he has taken and drive him into Hell, and evil it is as a destination."

(an-Nisaa' 4:115)

THE SECOND KHUTBAH

Let us unite upon the basis of authentic Islamic 'ageedah. The Muslims must remain united at heart in facing atmospheres, perverted ideologies, and threats by the enemies of Islam.

The solid unity of the Muslim ummah is the foundational strength towards the development of an ummah that is dignified, capable, and upright. Let us unite

upon the spirit of firm tawheed, الله إلا الله, affirmative principles within al-Qur'an and al-Hadeeth, as well as the Qudwah (exemplary) of Rasulullah

The high number of Covid-19 cases recorded in Selangor according to statistics truly necessitate strict adherence to the SOP regulated by the government, the SOP

released by JAIS in preventing the spread of Covid-19, and exercising selfcontrol in this very difficult situation. Let us increase our yaqeen (certainty)

in Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala, upholding his Oneness, purifying Him from other deities, as well as making tawbah (repentance). Let us ponder

upon our wrongdoings in the past, that Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala sends this calamity and pandemic upon us. Let us not get riled up in

spewing accusations, slander, or blaming those whom are diligently trying to overcome this severe predicament.

O Allah, You are the Lord that is All Mighty, we are grateful to You for having bestowed upon us rahmah and blessings upon this state that continues to

prosper and progress, and that its residents remain united, under the auspices and leadership of our Ruler as the Head of Islamic affairs in this state.

O Allah, protect us from calamities and pandemic such as Covid-19.
