

I solemnly remind myself and esteemed audience that let us strive to increase our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala by intensifying

our commitment in remaining upon His Path, that may we always remain on the Straight Path by fulfilling all of the commands of Allah and avoiding His prohibitions.

Today, I will be discussing upon a khutbah titled

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verses 151-153 of Soorah al-An'aam, ten wasiyyah (wills or testaments) that are waajib (obligatory) for us to abide by, and they will be the main subject for today's khutbah.

The First Will:

"Say, "Come, I will recite what your Lord has prohibited to you. [He commands] that you not associate anything with Him...""

Do not commit shirk or associate anything with Allah. Shirk associating anything with Allah is a matter that is of danger, utmost encompassing all evils, moreover it is the worst

of all evils that will not be forgiven by Allah.

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 116 of soorah an-Nisaa', which means:

"Indeed, Allah does not forgive association with Him, but He forgives what is less than that for whom He wills. And he who associates others with Allah has certainly gone far astray."

Shirk is of two types, namely apparent and hidden shirk. The apparent shirk is any form of 'ibaadah and worship for other than Allah, while hidden shirk is riyaa' that is doing good deeds with the intention of showing off to others.

The Second Will:

"...and to parents, good treatment..."

In another chapter (soorah), through verse 24 of soorah al-Israa',

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions:

"And lower to them the wing of humility out of mercy and say, "My Lord, have mercy upon them as they brought me up [when I was] small.""

There are just too many condemnations upon those that are undutiful and disobey their parents, among them is those that disobey their parents will not enter Paradise.

The Third Will:

".. And do not kill your children out of poverty; We will provide for you and them.."

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala forbade burying one's daughter alive and killing one's own son for fear of poverty or destitution. On the other hand, Allah provides rizq (sustenance) for the

parents and the child that is to be born. With that, do not be afraid of becoming poor, which is only an assumption, and do not fear destitution in the coming future. Our responsibility is to strive

and educate our children in the best possible manner so that they will abide by the authentic teachings of the religion and possess noble akhlaaq (character).

The Fourth Will:

"..And do not approach immoralities - what is apparent of them and what is concealed.."

This refers to major sins, its evil and harm, whether through utterances or actions. Likewise, with evils that are done privately and in secret. In the time of Jaahiliyyah (Ignorance),

they deemed that committing zinaa (adultery) in private is not wrong, only when committed openly it is deemed as bad. Same goes to fornication

these days, it is only deemed as unlawful if there is no consent from both parties.

The Fifth Will:

".. And do not kill the soul which Allah has forbidden [to be killed] except by [legal] right.."

killing Allah has forbade another human being without a just cause. Similarly, with what is going on these days, murdering infants without any feeling of pity, and other killings committed with cruelty.

The Sixth Will:

"And do not approach the orphan's property except in a way that is best until he reaches maturity.."

The sixth will is the command to preserve the property of the orphans with care. It is a major sin if the orphan's property is not administered properly and if it is taken without a valid reason.

The Seventh Will:

"...And give full measure and weight in justice. We do not charge any soul except [with that within] its capacity ..."

This will and command is with regard to giving full measurement and weight with justice. Allah admonishes those that cheat in their weighing and measurement. That is, when they are

weighing for others they would give less, but when they are getting measurements and weighing for themselves they would demand their full rights.

Allah's severe warning is mentioned in verses 1-3 of soorah al-Mutaffifeen, which means:

"Woe to those who give less [than due], Who, when they take a measure from people, take in full. But if they give by measure or by weight to them, they cause loss."

The Eight Will:

"..And when you testify, be just, even if [it concerns] a near relative.."

Example for being just in giving testimony is that comments, likes, shares, and subscribes upon a matter must be done with the balance of justice. It is a major sin for those that commit oppression

upon others even if it involves one's own relatives, as mentioned in the hadeeth of 'Abdullah ibn 'Umar radiyAllaahu 'anhuma where the Prophet said:

"Any person who takes a piece of land unjustly will sink down the seven earths on the Day of Resurrection."

(al-Bukhaari)

The Ninth Will:

"...And the covenant of Allah fulfill.."

It is waajib upon the Muslim ummah to fulfill

its covenant relating to the Sharee'ah of Allah, every matter deemed as lawful (halaal), unlawful (haraam), obligatory, and matters in which its ruling was determined in al-Qur'an.

The Tenth Will

is adherence to the teachings of al-Qur'an.

"And, [moreover], this is My path, which is straight, so follow it."

To end the khutbah today, let us altogether derive lessons and reflections to be taken as guidance in this life, as follows:

1. The Muslim ummah must abide by all that have been commanded and leave out all that have been prohibited.

2. The Muslim ummah must have certainty that every good deeds will be rewarded with Paradise, and every evil deed will be rewarded with Hellfire.

3. The Muslim ummah remain must istiqaamah (steadfast) with the religion of al-Islam, and not be influenced by heresy and shirk.

"And, [moreover], this is My path, which is straight, so follow it; and do not follow [other] ways, for you will be separated from His way. This has He instructed you that you may become righteous."

(Soorah al-An'aam 6:153)

THE SECOND KHUTBAH

Once more, I would like to remind all of us to always have the tagwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala by guarding ourselves and our families from abominable deeds and disobedience against

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala. At the same time, we will continue to pray so that our country will always remain blessed and protected from all forms of threat, as well as contagions from the Covid-19 pandemic.

May we become among the slaves of Allah that are patient while enduring all diseases afflicted, and disciplined in adhering to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and deriving lessons from

everything that has happened, always vigilant and mindful though we have been given a bit of freedom to move about. This is because the entire nation is still fighting the Covid-19 pandemic, for the



For those that are truly affected by this pandemic, do not take the easy way out by harming and injuring ourselves. We must be selfless, patient, and strong mentally and physically, built upon solid *imaan*.
