


JABATAN AGAMA ISLAM SELANGOR

by fulfilling all of His Commands and avoiding all of His prohibitions, as well as striving to pursue life that is blessed and pleasing to Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala.

Leaders with integrity is an important element and carry a huge role in developing behavior, people, society, and how a nation can be governed in an orderly manner, respected, and leaving

good legacy for the future. Virtuous values (mahmoodah) will manifest excellent norms and standards in the life of a leader. Leaders having integrity, honesty, and amaanah (trustworthy) not

only can change the landscape and ecosystem of communal life, moreover they will drive the country to attain the objective that has been formulated so that the country becomes

sustainable, stable, wellrespected, and having its own identity. Not a nation that is known with nifaaq (hypocrisy), plagued with issues and controversies pertaining power abuse, bribery, breach of trust,

betrayal, as well as provocation that will destroy the generation of integrity and unity of the nation and its people.

Integrity is strict religious adherence to principles, universal values and norms, and strong ethics. The best individual that we truly love, our beloved Prophet Muhammad , had

distinguished himself as the icon for the servant of Allah possessing high integrity, that he was known as 'al-Ameen', which is 'the one who is very trustworthy' among the Muslim community at

that time. Four personal attributes and praiseworthy traits of Rasulullah that upholds the meaning and serve as the core to the value of integrity are Siddeeg (truthful),

Amaanah (trustworthy), Tableegh (conveys), and Fatanah (wise). As Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala mentions in verse 21 of Soorah al-Ahzaab:

"There has certainly been for you in the Messenger of Allah an excellent pattern for anyone whose hope is in Allah and the Last Day and [who] remembers Allah often."

Integrity is complementary component be to emulated and in building a nation that is thriving, and peaceful, Integrity prosperous. based upon Islamic

values that is centered upon the strength of 'aqeedah, Sharee 'ah, and akhlaaq is the best solution for the destruction and turmoil occurring within oneself, organizations, and the

nation today. Ikhlaas (sincerity) and amaanah within a leader will shape and produce national policies that will uphold the interests of the people and national development that is

balanced, in spiritual and physical terms. On the contrary, leaders that purely yearn for authority and seeking worldly fortune will become pests and traitors to the people and nation.

There are a plethora of stories depicting the honesty of the Prophets and the Messengers that we can emulate from their life journey. Among them is where Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala

mentions the honesty and trustworthiness of Prophet Moosa 'alayhissalaam in verse 26 of soorah al-Qasas:

"One of the women said, "O my father, hire him. Indeed, the best one you can hire is the strong and the trustworthy.""

This verse actually carries a very deep meaning. It not only proves the strength and trustworthiness of Prophet Moosa 'alayhissalaam, but it

highlights the leadership quality Prophet Moosa 'alayhissalaam perfecting the tasks given with full integrity.

The traits of sincerity and trustworthy that are waajib (obligatory) upon every leader is the main condition stipulated by Islam so that the leaders can guide the society and nation towards good.

Its benefit or virtue will not only be reaped by that particular leader, but the entire society instead. Aside from that, the enculturation and practice of amaanah and ikhlaas in leadership are

also heavily emphasized in Islam. Wake up, dear leaders! Do not become traitors upon the amaanah bestowed. Refer to the words of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in verse 27 of soorah al-Anfaal:

"O you who have believed, do not betray Allah and the Messenger or betray your trusts while you know [the consequence]."

Verily, leaders that do not uphold the values of integrity, honesty, and trustworthy will only cause them to plunge into acts of disobedience and

hypocrisy such as bribery, abuse of power, breach of trust, and spreading fitnah, causing severe damage upon communal living and nationhood.

This warning was firmly by Allah stated Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala in verse 16 of soorah al-Israa':

"And when We intend to destroy a city, We command its affluent but they defiantly disobey therein; so the word comes into effect upon it, and We destroy it with [complete] destruction."

Observe the examples portrayed in al-Qur'an and also in the seerah (biography) of Rasulullah , where we find that honesty and trustworthy are identities that are integrated within the

leader. The leader must manifest not only gentle manners, but noble akhlaaq from the aspect of honesty and sincerity, as well as reliable and entrusted

by the people, moreover by other honored nations across the globe. At the same time, honest and trustworthy leaders are surely those that are not only honest

to others, but also to themselves.

In the *hadeeth* of Ma'qil bin Yasar, Rasulullah said:

"If any ruler having the authority to rule Muslim subjects dies while he is deceiving them, Allah will forbid Paradise for him."

(al-Bukhaari)

To end the khutbah today, I would like to summarize sermon into several essences, namely;

1. Every leader must remain diligent in abiding and practicing the traits of amaanah, honesty, and ikhlaas just as they were commanded by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala.

2. Leaders that betrays, cheats, and abuses power just to accumulate personal wealth will definitely be hated by the people and cursed by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala for it can destroy an entire nation.

3. If the leaders are corrupt, then the nation becomes corrupt, just like the old saying "if the water is murky upstream, then it remains murky downstream."

4. The Muslim ummah must avoid immoral acts and change to cling firmly upon religious principles and universal ethical values, so that we can altogether build a society of high moral and ethics, hence becoming a nation that is well-respected.

"And whoever turns away from My remembrance indeed, he will have a depressed life, and We will gather him on the Day of Resurrection blind." He will say, "My Lord, why have you raised me blind

while I was [once] seeing?" [Allah] will say, "Thus did Our signs come to you, and you forgot them; and thus will you this Day be forgotten." (Soorah Ta-Ha 20:124-126)

THE SECOND KHUTBAH

Let us altogether strive to have the tagwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala by increasing our obedience towards Him and avoiding acts of disobedience and abominable deeds.

O Allah, grant us guidance in performing the five obligatory prayers in congregation, fulfilling zakaat through Selangor Zakaat Board (LZS), making endowment (waqf)

through Perbadanan Wakaf Selangor (Selangor Endowment Corporation) and giving away our wealth (infaaq) through Tabung Infak Jariah Umat Islam Selangor (TIJARI, Selangor Continuous **Charity for Muslims Fund).**

Make us among Your slaves that fulfills the amaanah. Strengthen our imaan so that we avoid treachery, protect us from becoming among those that neglect their responsibilities, and protect

our state and nation from destruction due to bribery. Render the duty to lead our country upon Your slaves whom are trustworthy and honest, as well as firm and courageous in upholding

the truth and executing justice according to the Sharee'ah. O Allah, make the masaajid and suraus in the state of Selangor as Your peaceful homes,

uniting everyone, and serve as the heart of the ummah's strength. Therefore, it is prohibited for any politicians to speak in the masaajid or suraus in this state.
