On this blessed Friday, I sincerely remind myself and fellow audience to diligently strive in increasing our taqwa of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala, which is through

fulfilling the all commands of Allah and avoiding all of His prohibitions. Verily, taqwa is the best provision for blissfulness in our lives, whether in this world or the Hereafter.

The title of the Friday khutbah today is



Al-Qur'an is Kalaam Allah (the Word of Allah) that was revealed to our Prophet, Muhammad , in the Arabic language through the intermediary of angel Jibreel 'Alayhissalaam, conveyed

a mutawaatir in (successive) manner, beginning with soorah al-Faatihah and ending with soorah an-Naas, where its recitation is 'ibaadah (worship).

Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala had sent down al-Qur'an as a manual or guide to human life, as He mentions in the second verse of soorah al-Baqarah:

ذَلِكَ ٱلْكِتْبُ لَا رَيْبُ فِيهِ هُدًى لِّلْمُتَّقِينَ

"This is the Book about which there is no doubt, a guidance for those conscious of Allah."

The Book of al-Qur'an also expounds on the greatness of Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala, legislations in worldly life, and it is a mu'jizah (miracle) for all time.

Al-Qur'an and Hadeeth of Rasulullah are closely intertwined determining religious is to further rulings. It strengthen every provisions and rulings mentioned in al-Qur'an,

mentioned as Bayaan at-Tagreer, which means strengthening content of al-Qur'an. For example, the hadeeth pertaining to the command for wudoo' (ablution), namely the

statement of the Prophet which means:

"No prayer is accepted without ablution."

(al-Bukhaari and Muslim)

hadeeth This indicates taqreer (tacit approval) for verse 6 of soorah al-Maa'idah, which means:

"O you who have believed, when you rise to [perform] prayer, wash your faces and your forearms to the elbows and wipe over your heads and wash your feet to the ankles."

Indeed, the revelation of al-Qur'an is a blessed gift from Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala bestowed upon all of us, and it behoove us to constantly remain grateful, as He mentions in verses 1 and 2 of soorah al-Kahf:

"[All] praise is [due] to Allah, who has sent down upon His Servant the Book and has not made therein any deviance. [He has made it] straight, to warn of

punishment severe from Him and to give good tidings to the believers who do righteous deeds that they will have a good reward."

One special feature of al-Qur'an that is not found with other heavenly books is that it will be preserved by Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala Allah Himself. Subhaanahu Wa Ta'aala

mentions in verse 9 of soorah al-Hijr:

"Indeed, it is We who sent down the Qur'an and indeed, We will be its guardian."

It is very clear for us that this verse provides the guarantee regarding the sanctity and purity of al-Qur'an that is everlasting until the end of time from any tampering or forgery. Furthermore, every year

the number of its (huffaazh) memorizers increase, would the perfecting memorization of the verses of Allah. This is due to the awareness and strong interest within

the society towards religious education through the tahfizh (school for Quranic memorization) institution nowadays that many of these institutions are under the supervision of

religious state However, authorities. were all recently we startled by the damages inflicted upon manuscripts of al-Qur'an in the masaajid, suraus, schools, and private

residences due to the recent major floods in various districts within the state of Selangor. However, there have been sincere efforts from various quarters

in aiding JAIS (Selangor Religious Islamic Department) in collecting damaged copies of al-Qur'an. Over 155 tons of the holy scriptures and materials containing verses of al-Qur'an were

accumulated and disposed by JAIS, in line with the sense of responsibility embraced by the Department in preserving the sanctity of al-Qur'an.

Truthfully, in spite of such calamity, we are being tested to instill a sense of concern for the needs of our brethren whom are faced with tragedy, especially for the students whom are in

need of copies of al-Qur'an and religious books in continuing their learning. Therefore, JAIS implores all Muslims to make infaaq (donation) of RM30 per copy for the purpose of

waqf (endowment) of al-Qur'an to the Selangor Al-Qur'an Endowment (Post-Flood). Fund Through the Selangor Continuous Charity for Muslims Fund (TIJARI), JAIS targets as many as

50,000 copies of al-Qur'an to be distributed to masaajid, suraus, as well as religious schools and tahfizh institutions, and also members of the public who were affected by the flood,

as replacement for the damaged copies of al-Qur'an.

We should be grateful for the sanctity and nobility of al-Qur'an is still well preserved and

safeguarded in our nation. This is because the Ministry of Home Affairs (KDN) has been tasked to implement the enforcement and control of text and materials relating to al-Qur'an

through the Printing of Qur'anic Text Act 1986 (Akta 326). Through the Committee for the Review and Evaluation of Qur'anic Text (Lajnah Tas-heeh al-Qur'an) that is comprised of 35

individuals from among Qur'anic memorizers and experts in Qur'anic manuscript, it assumes the role of ensuring the authenticity of every verse of al-Qur'an before it is authorized to be printed.

In terms of enforcement, KDN local representatives in each state will carry out periodic monitoring in business premises, scheduled inspections in printing and publishing

companies, as well as integrated inspections based on complaints on any premises. Therefore, with enforcement and control, mus-hafs (Qur'anic copies) that are scattered nationwide

are safeguarded from errors and deviations.

While in the quality aspect, KDN obligates that every publisher use quality papers for the printing of mus-hafs,

abiding by the guidelines stipulated that is the method for marking verses or recitations, and also guidelines in naming the title of mus-haf.

The responsibility in preserving accuracy in the printing of Qur'anic in Malaysia manuscript integrated necessitate between cooperation agencies government and the general public.

To avoid any confusion, deviation, and falsification within the new printouts and publications, the general public must ensure that every mus-haf comes with the KDN approval

KDN stamp and hologram sticker as proof of validity for the print according to the approval determined by KDN's Board of Control and Licensing for the Printing of al-Qur'an.

If the opposite is found, then one can lodge a complaint to the state KDN office for the purpose of investigation, inspection, and enforcement.

To end the khutbah today, let us altogether ponder upon the following matters:

1. The Muslim ummah must have imaan (faith), yaqeen (certainty), and no doubt upon the truthfulness and teachings of al-Qur'an, which is kalaamullaah for the guidance of mankind.

2. The Muslim ummah must ensure that copies of al-Qur'an in possession have obtained authorization from KDN.

3. The Muslim ummah must comprehend that the nobility of al-Quran must be preserved by disposing it according to disposal procedures prescribed by state authorities.

4. The Muslim ummah must instill the recitation of al-Qur'an as daily practice and not just to garner rewards alone, moreover for tadabbur (reflection) and internalization in their daily lives.

"Indeed, it is a noble Qur'an. In a Register well-protected; None touch it except the purified. [It is] a revelation from the Lord of the worlds."

(Soorah al-Waaqi'ah 56:77-80)
